April 19, 1913. 3261 Pte. L. Coughlan. Sir:-Reference your communication of March 22nd conclosing letter from the mether of the above soldier with reference to pay. I return letter in question, and also attach copies of correspondence between Sir Walter Davidson, late governor and Mr. Windler, Manager Commercial Cable Company. whereby this man was attested on November 18th, under openial conditions, and that under arrangements with the Manager of the Gable Company, he was not to report fig duty with the Manager of the Gable Company, he was not to report fig duty with the Male company, receiving salary in this company receiving salary in this contention. Be attested on was carried out to give him the privilege of wearing uniform while doing his ordinary work, and he was not called upon to do any Milisary duty while de captoyde. The matter of attending drill was orbitoles in the part, and was mercely in the nature of permission given to attend the non-com-missioned officers class of instruction for his own benefit. During the period under review there were 250 parades of instruction class, of which Pto. Goughlan at-tended thirty two. Pto.
