"Sir, Re Graves of Crosbie and Wheeler.

I write to ask if you will kindly inform the relatives of
"the above named soldiers, now deceased, that the Grave Site of their
"son has been put in splendid order during the past fortnight, also
"that the flowers and foliage planted will stand the cold weather and
"bloom again next year. There has also been placed on each of
"these graves a nice artificial wreath of white roses with this
"inscription "DERNIER DEVOIR", a token from some french society.
"These are the only two of our brave fellows who have been buried in
"this town and my only regret is that it is not possible for me to
"visit other towns, such as Etretat, Havre, Boulogne, St. Pol, etc
"so that all of their resting places might receive the same attention.

"The cemetery in which the two men in question are buried is
"known by the name of St. Sever Cemetery, Rouen, and up to the present
"it contains some 3000 British soldiers each of whom is allotted a
"separate grave site. Also, there is a small wooden cross at the
"head of each bearing the soldier's Regtl. No., Rank, Name, and the
"name of his Regiment."

Further to my No. 4385/185, 23/10/16 I have the honour to state that No. 109, O.R.S. H. G. Jones, whilst attached for duty at the Base, Rouen took certain steps with regard to this subject, as reflected in the following extracts from his report to me.

"Sir, Re Graves of Crosbie and Wheeler

I write to ask you if you would kindly inform the relatives of the above named soldiers, now deceased, that the Grave site of their son has been put in splendid order during the past fortnight, also that the flowers and foliage planted will stand the cold weather and bloom again next year. There has also been placed on each of these graves a nice artificial wreath of white roses with this inscription "DERNIER DEVOIR", a token from some French Society. These are the only two of our brave fellows who have been buried on this town and my only regret is that it is not possible for me to visit other towns, such as, Etretat, Havre, Boulogne, St. Pol, etc., so that all of their resting places might receive the same attention.

The cemetery in which the two men in question are buried is known by the name of St. Sever Cemetery, Rouen, and up to the present it contains some 3000 British Soldiers each of whom is allotted a separate Grave site. Also, there is a small wooden cross at the head of each bearing the soldiers Regt. No., Rank, name, and name of his Regiment.

In a day or two I shall apply to the Graves Commissions and Enquiry Bureau, c/o British Consul Rouen, to have the Graves photographed for me and soon as received I shall immediately forward the same to you for transmission to the relatives of these men.

" Hence it seems to me that it is far advantageous that all applications for the photographs of the graves of our boys be made form your offices. I have been given to understand that the two in question have already been photographed and consequently it is only the matter of a few days when the same ought to be in your possession. With regard to all other grave sites it will take some little time after the applications have been made but eventually the complete list pught to be in your possession.

I am compiling this week a list of Burial Sites and will publish same in Daily Orders Part 11, which will be a lasting document for reference at any tiem. It was only during my recent chat with Anderson that he showed me the importance that the home officers places to this information in regard to the relatives of the deceased. I shall do my best to meet the demand.

It is known that we have as many as seven or eight men buried on the one grave and no doubt it can be arranged to secure a copy for each Family....."

Applications has been made to the proper quarter for photographs and futeher results will be reported

This is perhaps a matter for the N. W. C.A. to take up; in any case as inoother not strictly official matters, results are at the desposal and co-ordination of that body, meanwhile the subject is being pursued so far as may be consistent with other pressing work in this office.

A certain amount of expense may be incurred in this connection, which, it is assumed, can be paid ex Public Funds?



I am in receipt of an application from Capt. H.A. Anderson on your behalf, to have the temporary wooden cross which marks the grave of No. 1447 Pte. G. Crosbie, sent to this country for transmission to you.

I may say that the disposal of these crosses has been fully discussed by the Imperial War Graves Commission on which all the dominions are represented. The decision arrived at as to their disposal was that when the permanent memorials were erected, the wooden crosses should be gathered together and buried in France. Some months ago the question was raised and discussed by the Executive Government here, and the recommendation of our Government to the Imperial War Graves Commission was that as far as the Newfoundland Graves were concerned, the metal plates, on the crosses should be taken off and sent out here for distribution to the next of kin.

I should be glad to know whether the decisions outlined above would agreeable to you. Of course you will appreciate that in all matters of this nature a general course has to be outlined, and as regards the question under discussion, of the disposal of these wooden crosses, the Commission had in mind that when the permanent memorials were all erected, they would have tens of thousands of these
