Dear Sir:-

When in the Forestry Coy's I received War Service Gratuity for period while with them, but not covering period while with the C.E.F. The Nfld. Paymaster took it up with the Canadian Militia Dept. and advised me to communicate with them directly, which I did. I received word from them as follows:-

"Replying to the second paragraph of your letter of the 28th Feb., kindly forward to this office your discharge Certificate in order that your combined service in the C.E.F. and the Nfld. Forestry Coys. can be computed as it may be possible that you are eligible for more War Service Gratuity."

On receipt of this I wrote Nfld. Paymaster and he advised that Discharge certificates were not issued to Officers, and told me to send you Commission for endorsement. I never received my commission, presumably because I was O.S. when it was given, and I wrote the Nfld. office to this effect, but have not heard anything in reply.

I since have a letter from the Canadian A. D. P. S. asking for a reply.

As I received no commission and have no discharge certificate, I have no document to send them showing length of service in Nfld. Coy. Could you kindly let me have some certificate which shows length of service, from time transferred from C.E.F., to time of discharge, so that I can forward same.

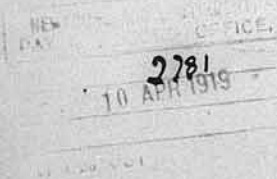

Dear Sir Walter Davidson,

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of July 25.

I note confirmation of your telegram (No. 620) notifying the ratification by the Executive Forestry Committee of the transfer of Lieut. H. S. Crowe from the Canadian to the Mfld. Forestry Corps. Will you please arrange for the commission to date from June 8th, the date on which Lieut. Crowe returned here on his recall from service with the C. F. C. in France? It is satisfactory that this little difficulty should have been solved. I think you will clearly realize how quite impossible my position here, as primarily responsible for the operations, and success or failure of the N. F. C. would be, if I cannot count on the support of the Executive Committee as regards this staffing of the Force. My position would be akin to that of a Managing Director, whose recommendations are turned down by his Board and has accordingly no option but to resign. With every possible desire to meet the naturally strong local feeling in favor of giving appointments to Newfoundlanders-born one must consider efficiency and not place of birth as the true test of selection. In regard to any question which may arise in the future respecting Commissions or Promotions in the Corps, I ~~am~~ propose as I indicated in my letter to you of June 22nd to consult with Major Sullivan so that all applications will go forward as our joint recommendation. I note that Mr. Josiah Goodyear has been recommended for the rank of Captain and that you have approved the same and his Commission is being issued. This may, of course, raise questions as regards relative seniority between him and other officers under whom he has worked in civil life, as you suggest. This is just one of those questions which I shall have to take up with Major Sullivan on his arrival. It would seem prima facie to involve sooner or later the necessity of promotion for both Lieuts. Crowe and Cole.

I have just received your memorandum giving the copy of Mr. Beaton's telegram expressing satisfaction at the appointment of H.E. Crowe.

I have been seriously considering the matter of separation allowance about which Major Sullivan is so anxious. I do not think that I could conscientiously concur in a separation allowance being made to the men of our Companies, for I feel pretty well assured that a demand would be made and with some force, by both our Naval and Military men, and I do not think the Colony can afford to have some millions of dollars added to its present debt, without a protest from somebody. I think we made a grave error when the pay of the Naval Reservists was advanced and I do not know that I would care to continue upon the Committee to be associated with such a costly addition to the Colony's debt. 

This officer was in the Canadian Forestry Companies serving in France, and at the request of Mr. Beeton, officer in charge Forestry Companies, was transferred for service with the Newfoundland Forestry Companies. His transfer dated from June 8th, 1917. I have no information as to the date of Lieutenant Crowe's original commission. The above commissions were granted at the recommendation of Mr. M.M.Beeton. the officer in charge of the Forestry Companies in the United Kindom, and Major M.S.Sullivan officer in charge Forestry Companies in Scotland.

Lieutenant Thistle would seem to rank on an equality with these officers and if establishment permitted should be considered for promotion. 




