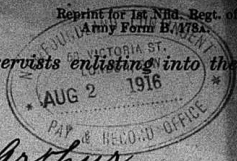

I now take the liberty of writing you to know if you can find out anything of my son, # 815, Private Arthur Cummings, of the First Newfoundland Regiment. (C. Company).

He was taken prisoner on April 14th, with some seventy more newfoundlanders, and taken to Limburg. Germany. We received a letter and two cards from him, the last card was dated Sept 2nd, on which he said he was quite well and working.

Last Thursday, the 15th, we received a message saying he had died in enemy hands, but no particulars of when he died and what caused his death were given.

If it were possible for you to find out anything relative to his death and communicate with me I would be more than thankful. I feel confident that you will do your very best for me and am thanking you in anticipation of an early reply.

With reference to your letter 21/11/17 (7882): it is presumed that by this time you will have been notified by the Department of Militia, St. John's, Newfoundland, of all the information concerning your son in the possession of this office.

On 19/7/17 a report was received that he was a Prisoner of War, his address being given as Limburg, Germany. As you may be aware there has been more difficulty in communicating with Prisoners at this address than with any others in Germany and it has now been ascertained that the reason is that in many cases this only means that the men are registered at Limburg whilst they themselves are working for the enemy in occupied territory. This is evidently the explanation of your son's case: he was employed behind the German lines in France where he contracted a sickness which unfortunately proved fatal, an official German List received through the War Office reporting him to have died at a Field Hospital on the 14th September last. He was buried in Grave No. 526, Tournai Cemetery, France.

It is much regretted that owing to the circumstances of Pte. Cumming's death it does not appear possible to gain any further particulars, but should any fresh details come to hand, they will be transmitted as customary to Headquarters, St. John's.

Notification of the fact of your being a Prisoner of War has been received, and which has been duly telegraphed to Newfoundland.

The Newfoundland War Contingent Association have also been notified by this Office, and will communicate with you direct with regard to food, arrangements of which are undertaken by them.

So far a direct notification from you has not been received, as in the case of other Prisoners of War, and which usually includes a request for clothing, with particulars of sizes, etc., especially as to boots: meanwhile with a view to avoiding what may entail considerable delay in your receiving supplies, this Office is drawing and transmitting to you through the Central Prisoners of War Committee, a first issue of clothing, based upon sizes implied by information stated in your attestation.

Any change of your address should be notified to this Office, which in turn will be transmitted to Newfoundland, and to the Newfoundland War Contingent Association.
