Notes.—(i.) It is with deep regret that I learnt this morning of the death of your son William, who has passed away after many years of suffering through wounds contracted on His Majesty's Service with the Royal Newfoundland Regiment.

I should like to extend to you, on behalf of the Imperial War Graves Commission, the privilege and right to bury your son side-by-side with his comrades-in-arms in the Military and Naval Plot in Mount Carmel Cemetery. At the present time there are ten soldiers and sailors buried in this Plot.

The Imperial War Graves Commission gives it's solemn pledge to erect a headstone over the grave and keep the whole Plot in perfect condition for all time. The cost of same to be borne by the Government of Newfoundland.
