I called at your office today and found you out. I wanted to speak to you about my son, No. 3004, Private George B. Darby. He enlisted while at school before he was eighteen and left here with the "Windsor Draft." He spent six months in active service in France, taking part in three drives, and was wounded on the second day of the Cambrai battle. On being discharged from hospital, he was found to be suffering from some affection of the heart and placed in Class "B2". He was still in that class when I last heard from him, doing light duty at Hazeley Down Camp.

Now if he is not <sup>going</sup> to be fit for Active Service again, he is wasting his time, as older men who are semi-invalids could do this work he is doing and he could return and go back to finish his College Course before he is too old. Please do not misunderstand me; I do not want him back if he is going to be fit to go back to Active Service, but if he is not then he can do better service to the Empire by coming back to College and getting ready for his future work.

Perhaps I ought to add that he is not aware that I am asking this. I suppose it is almost too much to ask if you will see him and tell him that you knew me or convey some greeting. Wishing you a very pleasant and safe journey,

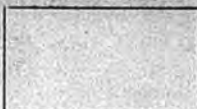
