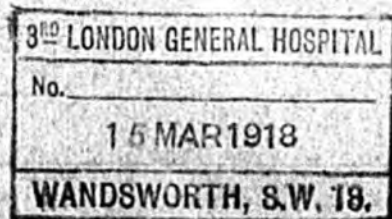

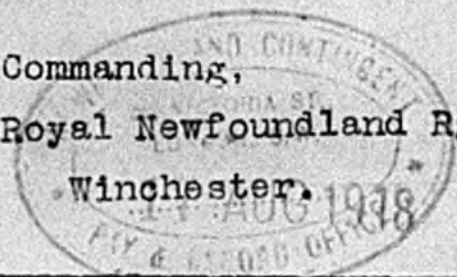

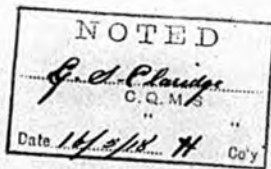

I trust you will bear with me for troubling you again and give me the information I need to clear up this question of "Gratuity and D.C.M. Cash award".

I was never told of any Cash award to go with the D.C.M. and was only acquainted with the fact, last year, by a Canadian holding that medal.

I have since found out that Canadians were given the Cash award when they were decorated.

I was "retired" on March 11, 1919 as a Commissioned Officer, But did not draw my gratuity until October 1919, and not knowing of any Cash award for D.C.M. (and incidentally not being told even then) I naturally thought the extra gratuity money was for Commissioned rank.

Was I not entitled to a

Commissioned Officers' gratuity? I would also be very much obliged to have the gratuity rates both for Commissioned and non-commissioned Officers.

I would also crave your attention for the matter of a pension for all holders of D.C.M. medals. I saw the authority for one (for one half-penny per day) from the British Pensions Office, Canadian Branch, Ottawa to one holder of the D.C.M. (a Canadian). He applied for it last year (1936) and was granted back pension at the rate of 1/2d. per day.

I was recently interviewed by the above named, who wondered if there was any further action which could be taken in connection with his claim to pension both because of gunshot wound and defective hearing.

I note in the fall of 1935 Mr. Davis' claim was considered, but it was then felt no assessable degree of disability was present, and therefore an award of pension could not be made. Mr. Davis however, now feels that his gunshot wounds and defective hearing are causing him a severe degree of handicap, and has asked that representations be made in the hope that perhaps equitable compensation will be made for any disability now present.

I may say Mr. Davis struck me as being a very sincere type, and I also noted his outstanding service. Because of these reasons I am prompted to ask if you will be kind enough to review this case and ascertain if there is a possibility of further examinations being granted to determine if this ex-officer now has an assessable degree of disability consequent upon any service disablement.

Dear sirs:-

Your letter of Sept. 15th. 1935 came to me as a distinct shock, knowing the nature of my war wounds, and which you can verify by looking up my medical sheets from overseas. Two bullet wounds completely thru' the right leg, one above the knee (Oct 12, 1916) which went thru' the muscle and the other thru' the ankle joint, necessitating the removal of nine pieces of bone and cutting the nerves leading to the toes, resulting in permanent stiffness of second joints of all toes on right foot, also swelling of ball of foot which has never gone back to normal, skin on side of foot at the wound grown fast to bone, surely this has been noted on my medical sheets.

My official marking at the Depot after the ankle wound was April 14, 1917, was B 3. That was the last examination I received in the army as far as the infantry was concerned.

I volunteered and went to France after

that, but was not examined for wounds.

Went to hospital in France with blood poison in hand and got shipped back to England on my wound of April 4, 1917, having gone to same hospital in Boulogne, where the doctors wanted to take off my foot ~~at~~ on my former visit.

While in England this time, made application for Royal Air Force and passed successfully. But a wound on the foot did not come into the question at that time as permanent cripples could qualify for pilots.

While in the Air Force at Reading, I had a very severe attack of sciatica, which the Air Force doctors said was directly due to my war wounds and of course being in that damp district. It certainly was all in my right leg and hip and has been recurring ever since during damp weather, tho' not to the same extent as I am not living in a damp locality. But there is always the weakness of my right leg and foot. I could have gone to Christ's St. hospital for examination a cripple, just by walking to the hospital, a distance of 3 miles, even on that sunny day in August. If that is not a disability caused from war wounds, then what is?

In the Spring of 1919 after coming back from overseas I was a cripple as lots of people in St. Johns can testify and was advised to get away from the salt water and damp air.

You may ask why I did not get a board then. I will be quite honest and say I had never heard of such a thing as a pension at that time. When I went in to the doctor for discharge, I had no examination whatever. The doctor just asked how I felt. I said alright, and that was the extent of the examination. (Could give details if necessary)

Again you may ask, why I let it go that long. Well, while I was single and not in want I did not worry about pensions. Now I have a family to take care of and knowing I am quite eligible for pension, I thought it high time I applied for pension.

I have not been trying to put one over on the Pensions Board and that makes your communication all the harder to bear.

I hereby beg of you to reconsider your decision.

I have been back to Christie St. Hospital

and conversed with Dr. Carson (head of hospital).
 He was quite surprised I was not receiving
 a pension and so far as I could gather
 (tho' not definitely stated) every examination is
 held for the specific purpose of cutting down
 the pensions, if possible.

Dr. Ecclestone evidently made a better job of
 impressing you to that end, than he did of
 examining me.

No doubt you will be surprised to hear from me, but you know what the old saying is "A friend in Need." So how about it? It is about Bert. Now he doesn't know a thing about me writing to you, but I'm awfully worried about him & his condition. I feel as though I can write you for some advice & maybe you could see for me what could be done from that end.

Last Sunday we went for a short walk we were only out a short while when he wanted to sit down so we got a bench & had a rest before long he said do your mind if we go home, well about half a block from him he asked to have the carriage alone & believe me he used it as a crutch, his leg had gone all numb, when we got home we worked on it for some time before we could get the feeling of pins & needles into it, it had gone all white & lifeless, about 6" above & below

the knee. Monday morning he had to report to work at 8. AM. his work calls for constantly being on his feet. I'm awfully worried Ches. because the Government will not do a thing for him here, not even admit him to the Soldier Hospital for an examination because he's an ^{enlisted} soldier (an Imperial they call them here.) & doesn't draw a pension. If he had a pension or an order on his govt he could get some attention, but you know how soft Bert is to fighting for what belongs to him. I do know he would be so grateful for any advice you could give us as to what ropes to pull or to whom to write in St John because Ches. he must have attention & I feel as though this is a Government obligation. Maybe I have not made this as clear as I might about his wounds. They are all in the foot & leg. There are 9 pieces of bone out of the ankle, he never has use of his big toe & the next one, they are stiff, stone cold & lifeless always. But this isn't where his trouble of Sunday was at all, but in ^{addition} a shoe

wound under the knee & through
 the muscle & nerve there, it is from
 this wound he suffers from sciatica.

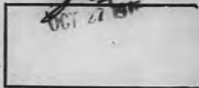
