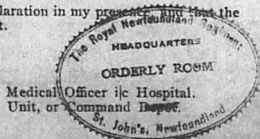

Could you kindly tell me how many post parcels of cigarettes and tobacco I should receive per month? I have had two so far.

I think, Sir, The Canadian parcels and Huntley and Palmers biscuits which you have decided to send the Nfldrs. who are prisoners of war are the best you could send us, and speaking personally I am very grateful to you.

I should ask my people at home to send me an additional number of post packets but it would simply be a waste of money. The Canadians of this Camp have written their Society on different occasions asking to have their cigarettes sent in food parcels. I have not received any post packets since January but my grocery parcels are coming regularly enough. I have also received four clothing parcels from you, every article was perfectly satisfactory with the exception of the boots which were a size too large. I should like to have size 6 boots, size three clothing and size seven cap sent me in my next issue.

I must thank you for the trouble you are taking in us and hope that I am not bothering you too much.

I wrote some time ago asking you to send me a private parcel which I hope you will be able to send through as I would prize the articles I asked for very much.
