I would again like to say a word about the parcels we have been receiving lately. The parcels are not as good as one would think they should be. I saw a list in "The British Times", the monthly paper of the camp, stating the list of articles in the parcels which the Central Prisoners of War Committee sends, they are a lot better than what we are getting at present. The parcels which were sent in Aug. Sep. and Oct. last year were fairly good, but now we are receiving parcels which have no tea, sugar or milk in them; and tea, sugar and milk are the main things, as Newfoundlanders are great tea and booze drinkers. As Booze is very scarce here we have to drink a lot of tea. We get Quaker Oats and Rice in every parcel, a little less of that, and some other substitute instead, would be better. I suppose it is not possible to get some Nfld. Lobster. I wrote some time ago asking for a shaving outfit; if you cannot send an open razor, send a Gillette please. With regard to boots and clothing, my great-coat is

a size or more too large, one pair of boots were size 7 and my right size is 9-6, one pair were tens they were O.K.

J. Thompson No. 139. uniform is one size too small. Boots, one pair were too large and one pair were too small. Size 8-4 is right. The underclothing, especially the vests and pants were also too small. Trusting you will give this matter your most careful attention,
