I hope you will pardon my intension. I am now going to ask you if it is in your power to do me a favour. I know you are the right man with Mr. Squires. I want you to kindly use your influence in getting my back money that was stopped belong to my poor boy that was killed in the war, or at least some little pension. You know Mr. Brownrigg I did not get my money since 1918. There's lots getting money that dont need it half as bad as I do. If my husband was able to work I'd never look for it. He is sick now two years sent home from hospital incurable, and I am a invalid myself for this last nine years with a sore foot trying to get around somehow. Of course I have two boys working; one at the Post Office that have not pay enough to keep himself, and the other boy is somewhere in the states but no held to me. He enlisted with the Canadians served eight monthsend was turned down and ~~discharged~~ discharged. We have a daughter 12 years old to keep to school. When my boy enlisted he was on the Glencoe and giving me all his pay, both himself and father were together when he enlisted. His allotment was 70¢ per day. Dont you think, Mr. Brownrigg, that I was entitled to Gratuity money as well as others

Sir-

Mr. Squires has asked me to reply to you in connection with the case of No. 2225, Thomas J. Delaney, deceased.

This man enlisted on March 6th, 1916, and was killed in action on November 20th, 1916. In the ordinary course a man's pay, and therefore, his allotment ceases from date of death. The practice has been authorised that this allotment when payable to a parent, shall be made to continue for two years after date of death. The Board of Pension Commissioners then considered the case, and if pension is not payable, ordered the cessation of payment of allotment, and refunded the amount already paid to this Department. If a pension is payable, they adjust the account for the past two years, refund to this Department the amount of allotment paid out, and continue to pay pension cheque.

In this case the allotment of 70¢ per day was continued from date of death as noted above, until the 28th February, 1919, which is three months after the two years. The case has been considered by the Board of Pension Commissioners, when the allotment was ordered to cease on 11th March, 1919, and it was ruled that no pension was payable owing to the fact that it was certified that the father, Mr. Michael Delaney, aged 56 years, was employed with the Reid Newfoundland Company, at the salary of \$37.00 per month, on S.S. "Glancee". The case was considered on a claim dated May 3rd, 1919 on which it was stated that there were two other sons; one aged 20 years, single, who was a telegraph operator was stated by the Postmaster to be drawing a salary of \$56.65 per month; the second, aged 17 years, single, was working as a brakeman in North Sydney. It was also certified that for the year prior to 23rd April, 1919 the father's weekly earnings were \$15.50.

Under the foregoing circumstances, the Board of Pension Commissioners were unable to grant a pension in this case.
