Reference your further letter of the 13th inst., we have looked up all your accounts again and find that the position is exactly the same as stated in my letter of July 21st. You received full pay and allowances up to and including April 21st. The \$14.40 board paid you on April 7th was for the period April 7th to 21st and you were previously paid your board while staying at the Institute from March 24th to April 7th. The item of \$7.00 for discharge pay, less allotment, was for the period April 7th to 21st and not for the previous two weeks as you suggest.

You had a considerable debit balance against you on arrival, which more than counter balanced your Regimental Pay up to April 7th, leaving a final amount of \$7.50 still outstanding.

I trust this is all now quite clear to you.
