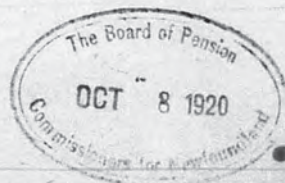

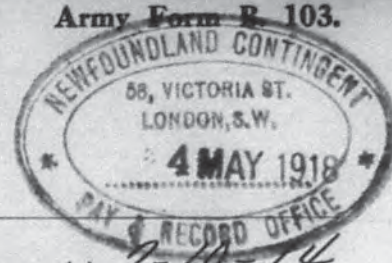



The above named man is retained on the strength to assist the Department in that most important work relative to the restoring of disabled men, namely: Massage. Consequently owing to the deferring of his discharge he is not entitled to War Service Gratuity at the present time but of course after the Regiment is in a position to dispense with his services as a masseur and to permit him to take his discharge he will be entitled to the Gratuity. He is a married man and as you are doubtless aware the married men are finding very great difficulty in finding housing accomodation in the City. A month or two, ago he had the opportunity of purchasing a house on very reasonable terms and entered into a contract so to do. I attach hereto a statement which shows the particulars of his contrace and his relation thereto.

The Civil Re-Establishment Committee is of opinion that in all the circumstances the advance of a considerable portion of the War Service Gratuity that will come due to him some day should be made to him in a lump sum in order to enable him to live up to his contract. I am sure that this case will be dealt with by you in the most sympathetic manner possible.



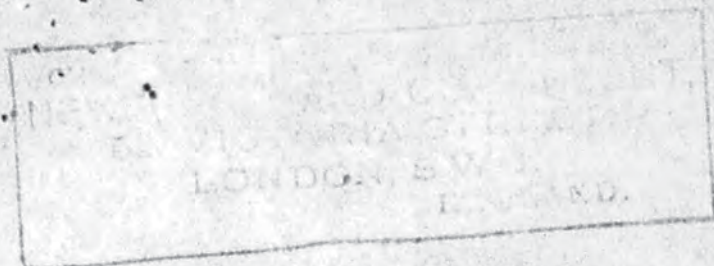


