

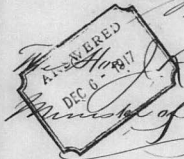

He came home August 1915 a nervous wreck, completely broken in mind and body and was under the doctor's care for a long while, he earned nothing whatever till July 1916 when he worked for 3 months, after that he worked at small jobs here and there whenever he could get work it was possible for him to do, but was mostly out of employment. In May 1919 he went to Cape Breton, where he got occasional employment he cannot work down in the mines and cannot work at Carpentry or painting neither can he go to sea as he could not go aloft on account of shakened nerves and I have no expectation of receiving my maintenance from him he can only maintain himself.
