X I shall be personally obliged if you will take the necessary steps to see that some Paymaster pays the above other allowance due to me to Cox & Co. As a Regular Officer employed by with Nfld Reg. but not paid by Nfld Govt I have fallen between 2 stools in the matter of allowances. Before leaving England the Regt. sh^d have applied for & sh^d have rec^d 6 or 8 weeks advance of allowance, but he apparently omitted to do this. I know no paymaster will pay me, & being on active service now & as paymaster within 20 miles I can do nothing.

I asked the Paymaster in Cairo about it & he wrote the enclosed slip of allowances due to me but referred me for payment to Paymaster Mediterⁿ. Supt. Force Alexandria, who replied officially refusing flatly to pay me anything saying I ought to get it from Nfld Govt - which was wrong. Next day we left Egypt so I c^d do nothing further. In addition to the allowances on enclosed slip, 1/3 (over)

I was also, as a regular officer entitled to Colonial All^{ce} of 3/- per day for the 15 days we were in Egypt. A question was asked about this in the House of Commons, and the answer given was that it was being paid, which in my case is untrue. The Lodging all^{ce} was also due to me for 15 days in Egypt under some special order, & other regular officers in Egypt were getting it. Payable to bachelors & officers whose wives were not in Egypt. (mine was at home)

Before leaving Egypt I wrote officially to the GOC protesting against the Med. Supd. Force Paymaster's refusal to pay me, & this may have produced the enclosed letter from him rec^d by me today. I shall be much obliged if you

will please yourself in communication with the necessary people, and get the matter settled as to who is to pay my allowances, & see that they do actually remit the money to Cox & Co. Had I been with my own Regt. I should have been paid as a matter of course, and I cannot afford to pay for the honour of Osmania with the Lawford's Regt by losing a not inconsiderable sum of money.

Capt Rondell, Aapt, was of course not acquainted with the necessary procedure, & now he is slightly wounded & not with the 11th Regt.

I am anxious to get the matter settled as I have arranged with Messrs Cox & Co for my wife to draw on my account with them.

On 2nd December '15 I was sent away from the Newfoundland Regt. at Suvla Bay very ill. With me, in my bed valise, was also sent a small book containing the Canteen Accounts of Nfld. Regt. and 2 cheque books, viz. 1 on British Linen Bank, Edinburgh, and 1 on the Anglo-Egyptian Bank, Cairo (Abbassieh branch).

I am now in Blue Sisters Hospital, Malta, and having consulted the Command Paymaster, Malta, as to the best course for me to pursue, have this day sent the account book and the 2 cheque books by registered post (and here-with enclose the receipt), addressed to the Officer Commanding Newfoundland Regt., British Med. Exped. Force.

The delivery of letters and parcels at the front is so uncertain that the possible non-delivery of the account and cheque books to the O.C. must be reckoned with. It seems right therefore to inform you of what has happened, and to make it clear to you that at the present moment there is a sum of money (£344.14.4 according to my accounts) on deposit at the British Linen Bank, Edinburgh, belonging to the men of the 1st Newfoundland Batt. (which left England in August); and also another sum with the Anglo-Egyptian Bank, Abbassieh, Cairo, which may be anything from £10 to about £50. The uncertainty as to exact amount is because Messrs. R. Dickeson & Co., Contractors, Cairo (& England) owed, and still owe if they have not paid, an amount on account of Canteen Rebate for the period (about 8 days) during which the Battalion was in Camp at Abbassieh. (Note rebate for the previous days spent in Barracks at Abbassieh was paid by the Nile Storage Co.). In spite of several letters from me to Messrs. Dickeson and also to the Anglo-Egyptian Bank, I have never been able to ascertain whether Messrs. Dickeson & Co. have paid the amount into the Anglo-Egyptian Bank, as they promised to do when the Regt. left Egypt suddenly for Suvla.

The total of these two Bank accounts has accrued from Canteen Rebates, and stands in the name of the President Regimental Institutes, Newfoundland Contingent, and as things stand at present nobody can draw on the accounts except myself.

I am not likely to return to the Battalion for at least several weeks and therefore think it right to send the accounts to the O.C. (who ever he may be).

Not knowing who the O.C. or P.R.I. now are, or even what Officers are with the Battalion, I am unable to notify the banks of the name of an Officer who will operate on the account instead of myself.

As the total amount which has been allowed to accumulate is rather large, I suggest that you make no reference to the matter in London, lest the War Office or Board of Control become too much interested. But the money, as it has not been spent, belongs bona fide to the Regt. Should it ever fall to you to have anything to do with the final disposal of the balance you should note that the Officers of the Batt. have no interest in the money, and the Sergeants also no, or practically no-interest, it having resulted from Rebates paid on account of money spent in the Canteens by the Rank and File. Herewith I enclose a copy of the last page of the account with each bank which has today been sent by me to the O.C.

Unfortunately Daily Orders have not reached me regularly, whilst those from 1/11/15 to 16/1/16 appear to have been lost altogether.
