Sir :-

I take the liberty of writing you re 4625, Pte. Edward Drover, about whom I wired you on 18/9/1918, and received a reply quoting Rev. Rusted's report. As this man has not yet turned up at Barracks, I am desirous of obtaining complete information about the affairs of his family, so that I can lay the matter before the Commanding Officer for his attention. As matters are at present, he has been away since 14/7/1918 on the grounds of his Mother's illness, and I should like to know if it is absolutely necessary that he be at home all the time. Judging by the past, if he is allowed to stay away on these grounds, it may be months before he returns, and unless his case is very urgent, I do not think this state of affairs with regard to him should be continued. His money has been paid him since his absence, so that it is evident the family is not in needy circumstances. Will you please let me know if there is anyone else at home besides the Mother, and Eldred, and if the latter has been working in a civilian capacity during the summer. You will understand of course that this letter is not directed to you in order for us to deal harshly with Drover, but we want to be in a position to

Harbor Grace, Oct. 26, 1918

Dear Sir,--

I saw both Privates ⁴⁶²⁵ Eldred Drover and (Fr^oderick) Ernest Mercer of Upper Island Cove, to-day.

Drover's statement was that he had leave for a few days, and that as his mother was dangerously sick he asked for an extension which was granted. His mother died about the latter part of September, and since then he waited for a notice to report. I believe the private really misunderstood his position. I explained the position, and advised him to go on and report without delay, and to explain his actions truthfully and explicitly. He said he would go on to St. John's by Monday's afternoon train.

Mercer's statement was that he came home on leave, and has been sick more or less ever since. I sent him to Dr. Cron for a report. Dr. Cron's report or certificate is sent herewith. When I saw Mercer I imagined he was suffering from ^{some} constitutional trouble. I thought it was tuberculosis, as he looked very wane and had no color in his face. The doctor's report gives heart trouble as the cause of Mercer's illness. Mercer said he would go over next week.

Both privates did not appear to fully comprehend their position. They are ^{not} over-stocked with intelligence, and their break is not due entirely to a wish to evade their duty. Drover has a brother in the R.N.R., and has served since the opening year of the war.

I am only willing to do what I can for the good of all concerned, and I am conscious that in these cases that the boys' neglect has been neither deliberate nor intentional.

Dear Sir,--

Your letter, respecting information of Private ELDRED Drover, of Upper Island Cove, received.

Two days ago I wrote Capt. Howley, and gave the information that the mother of this Private had passed away some two weeks previous. I saw Private Drover several times since he was home, and he gave me to understand that he was on leave for some two months. I knew that his mother was very ill and likely to pass away any day. That information was given by the Rev. E. E. Rusted. Since his mother died, I saw him on the street here, but did not speak to him. He has a brother in the R.N.R., and he was home ~~since~~ since the mother died.

I thought it strange that Private Drover was home so long, but thought that his leave was on account of his mother's serious illness. As far as I know there is a married sister, and a younger sister, but I do not know if there are any brothers beside the R.N.R. About money: I fear the opposite to your supposition is the fact, because I had a request to supply some little ready help for the mother the week or so before she died.

If you wish I could have Private Drover here and explain matters to him.

There is another Private home on leave--Frederick Mercer. I spoke to him one day about a month ago, and he told me he was sick, and ~~no~~ means. I gave him an order for his dinner, and advised him to see Dr. Cron. Since then I have seen him again, and he said he was no better. I advised him to report the fact to the Militia authorities. He said he had leave for two months. This man, I believe, is sick, and to judge by his looks he is on the way to a more serious malady--tuberculosis. I thought the best place for him was in St. John's where he could be treated, and I told him so.

Harbor Grace, Oct. 15, 1918

Dear Capt. Howley,--

Yours of the 12th inst. received to-day.

Agnes Drover, the mother of Private Eldred Drover, of Upper Island Cove, died some ten days ago. I received a telegram concerning this Private, and answered in effect that the man's mother was dying.

Eldred Drover is or was home a few days ago. I saw him on the street here, but did not speak to him. Some time ago I saw him and asked him was on leave. He replied that he was home on account of his mother's illness.

Another soldier is home in Island Cove--Private Frederick Merker. He is sick, and I advised him one day to see the doctor, and since I advised him to report to headquarters that he was sick. I think this soldier is a sick man, and he should be seen to.

During the time that Mrs. Agnes Drover was sick, I advanced two dollars to her son-in-law for her, on the recommendation of the Rev. E. E. Rusted. Mrs. Drover has a son in the R.N.R.--Ambrose Drover. He was home about a week or so ago--just after his mother died.

You could protect me in the sum of two dollars, as it was really advanced on the strength of the son being in the Regiment.
