Sir;

Reference your letter of the 3-9-18, regarding your son 5607.L/Cpl, John.C.Duder. I have to inform you that as he enlisted voluntarily, a claim for exemption cannot be considered. The age at which a man may enlist voluntarily still stands at 18, although a man who does not enlist this way is not called for service till he is 19. However in view of his age and the fact that he is needed at home to assist you, he has been granted three months leave without pay. This leave expires on December 9th, 1918, and if you find at that time you still need him I would advise you to write the Officer Commanding a few days before he is due to return and obtain an extension. I have no doubt that under the circumstances same will be readily granted.
