

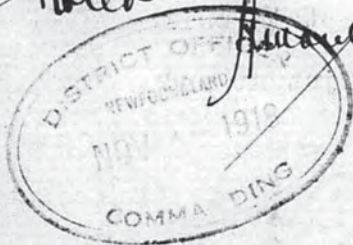


I enclose communication from the Officer Commanding Depot covering letter from the marginally named officer in connection with the duties he is performing at Headquarters, and claiming the special allowances relative to the performances of such duties.

The duties performed by Lieut. Duley are such as would ordinarily be performed by an officer of the rank of captain, and involve the work and responsibility that would usually appertain to that rank. While Lieut. Duley has not technically been performing the work in its entirety that would be performed by a Paymaster in the Canadian Army, where one is usually attached to a battalion, he has been doing the work of an officer commanding company, which would entitle him to equivalent emoluments. He has also been acting as Assistant Adjutant, for which no special working pay has been provided. Since the Military Service Act came into force, his duties have been considerably increased, and are altogether out of proportion to the rank he is now carrying.

In view of the organization of the Depot it is important that the payment of the men be handled through one permanent officer, and I would recommend the appointment of Depot Paymaster to be made, and that Lieut. Duley, who is at present doing this work, as Assistant Adjutant be designated as Assistant Adjutant and Paymaster.

I would further recommend that while filling this position, that Lieut. Duley be promoted to temporary Captain from September first.

SIR:

I have the honour to bring before your notice certain matters in connection with my standing as a Headquarters Officer and to request that you forward this letter to the proper authorities for their consideration and attention. I purpose to outline my duties as an officer since being attached to Depot and in conjunction therewith to make a claim for extra duty pay, which I consider I am rightfully entitled to receive.

I took up duties in the C.I.B. Armoury 2nd August, 1917, and was appointed Officer Commanding Companies, my duties being to take charge of and conduct all the administrative and routine work in connection with all ranks on Regimental Strength. The work I took over was previously carried out by Capt. Clift, assisted by 2/Lt. Fraser, but as both these officers severed their connection with the Depot on or about the day I took over, I had to do the work unaided.

In addition to the usual Orderly Room work, while the Depot was conducted at the Armoury, I had to look after the enlistment of every recruit and attest him, also originate all documents in connection with him and have entries made thereon as occasion demanded, attend to the issue of and Registration of Badges issued to Rejected Recruits, attend to the proper housing of all men and pass bills for their billeting, issue all transportation warrants and check same on presentation of bills from Railroad and Steamship Companies. Above was in addition to the duties of Assistant Adjutant and making the semi-monthly pay to men on Depot Strength and assuming all responsibility of same. It is in this latter connection that I make a claim for extra duty pay from Aug. 2nd, 1917, at the rate of a Paymaster in a Canadian Unit, i.e. \$3.75 per day. My Pay Sheets have ranged for monthly cash payments from \$4000.00 to \$30,000.00, and as you can readily understand, the responsibility is not a light one. The number of active accounts has been from 400 to 1200, which have to be correctly balanced at the end of each month. At the present time I have 950 active accounts on the list.

In support of my application, I bring before your notice that

- (a) Cooks, Masseurs, Armourer Sergeant etc. all draw extra pay for their duties,
- (b) As Assistant Adjutant I do not draw any extra pay, though the Adjutant is entitled to 50¢ per day.
- (c) The Adjutant is responsible for the discipline, Parade Ground Work, details etc. and the Asst. Adjutant for all administrative and clerical work etc., duties which very often mean working well into the night by both the Orderly Room Staff and myself.
- (d) Provision is made in a Canadian Unit for a Regimental Paymaster and owing to the peculiar nature of the work here it is necessary


that all payments be made by one person, so that accounts can be properly kept and transferred, consequently the work of Officer Commanding Companies, as far as Pay is concerned, resolves itself into duties identical with those laid down in Canadian Regulations for a Regimental Paymaster.

(e) That under the above conditions this claim is a just and fair one.
