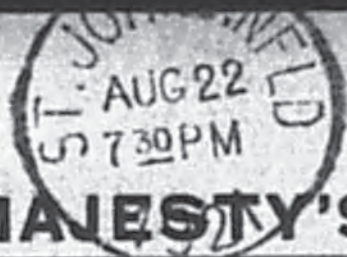

With reference to your telegram dated 17th November, 1921, I beg to inform you that although the date of death appears wrongly on the temporary wooden cross over the grave of the above-mentioned deceased officer, the records in this office and reports submitted to the Imperial War Graves Commission show the correct date, 29th September, 1918.

As can be noticed from other photographs of wooden crosses sent to Newfoundland, some of the regimental particulars are incorrect; the Imperial War Graves Commission have decided to let these stand for the present owing to the enormous amount of work it would entail to make corrections on individual crosses.

However, when the permanent stones are erected and photographed it will be noticed that all particulars as shown on the Cemetery Register Forms received from all the next-of-kin will appear thereon.

I should be much obliged if you would get into communication with ~~Capt.~~ Nangle and find out if the Grave of my brother, who was killed on September 29th, 1918, has yet been located and if it has, inquire from him where the Body has been re-interred.

The Map reference as to the place of his first grave, from information on file in your Department, seems to be pretty definite and as I noticed from "Viators" articles which appeared in the Daily News some weeks ago, that the body of Capt. Rendell had been removed to a Cemetery, it occurred to me that probably by this time Lionel's had been removed as well, as I understand they were within a short distance of each other when they were both killed.

If the Body has been removed to a regular Military Cemetery, will you please have ~~Capt.~~ Nangle send out a Photograph of the Grave as Mrs. Duley is very anxious to have this, if it is possible; and she is constantly inquiring of me whether I have received any information as to the disposal of His Body.

Will you kindly get this information for me as quickly as possible.

2nd Lieut. Duley was killed on the morning of September 29th about 11 o'clock. He was hit in the thigh by a Machine gun bullet while leading his platoon in the front wave of the attack and before he could be taken back died, probably from shock and severe loss of blood. He was buried where he was killed, a cross being erected by the Regiment.

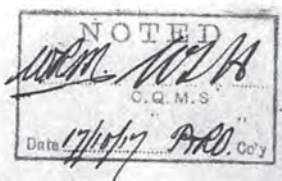

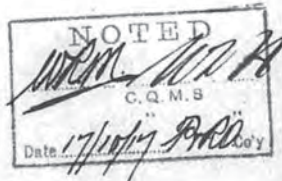


