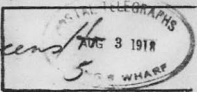

Statements made concerning an explosion which happened in the billet used by Battalion H'Qrs. runners. Ludansques, France 12/1/18.

1. Statement made by 2827 Pte. A. Vatcher.

At Ludansques, France, on January 12- 1918, at about 4.20 p.m., I was in the Billet used by the Battalion H.Qrs. runners. We had just come off the ceremonial parade and were sat around the fire place eating tea. I was sat in from of the fire place, Corpl. Dunn was sat on my right. Pte. Payne was on my left. Pte. Chaffey picked up a piece of heavy wrapping paper from the floor and placed it on the fire. Shortly after he placed it on the fire there was an explosion and Corpl. Dunn was hit in the right knee and Pte. Payne was hit in the right hand. I was not hit. There had been a fire since early in the morning.

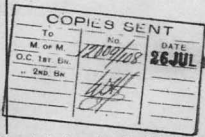

With reference to your letter dated 4/1/17 (379) I have the honour to state that there is no record here of the registered parcel in question.

It has been noticed from time to time that parcels marked as registered are included in bags with ordinary unregistered matter, but not being indicated as registered either on parcel bills or otherwise, are treated as ordinary mail matter; Register receipts neither being given nor obtained.

It is suggested that enquiries be instituted at the Post Office where the parcel was posted, and Register receipt quoted.

Pte. Dunn formed one of Draft No. 8 which left this Country to join the B.E.F. 8/7/16, and assuming that the parcel reached this office it would have been thence readdressed.

? A copy of your letter has been forwarded to the 1st Bn., but from previous experience it is not thought that this course will reveal any further information.

Reference may be made to my No. 4695/57, 7/11/16, and in this connection generally I enclose a copy of my No. 5751/192 exchanged with the C.C. 1st Bn. Also I may add in a general way that prior to 23/9/16 no record of parcels passing through this office was kept, except with regard to registered matter. Up to that date it was the practice, after checking, to return the Parcel Bills to the G.P.O., St. John's. Since then, and without any request from the P.M.G., St. John's, to the contrary, the bills are retained here and serve as a record.

It is regretted that for the reasons stated, more definite information cannot be given.

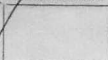

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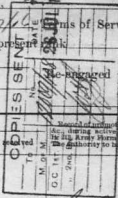
