Private Dunphy, as you may be aware was killed in action in Gallipoli 12/12/15

Pte. J. Dunphy, # 44 was accidentally killed by bullet striking & glancing off periscope held by sentry in fire trench, it was instantaneous, I reached his side about 1 1/2 minutes after it occurred, at the time of accident he was sat on the fire step eating his tea.

He was buried at place known as "Cross Ravine"; same cemetery as Capt. Wighton, & funeral was attended by Lieut. Taylor, Officer of Platoon #6, which platoon Dunphy was in.

On enquiry O.C.B. Company informs me that he has replied to yours of 11th ult. stating that he got. Pte Dunphy was buried in Essex Ravine.

This is incorrect. As far as I remember only two graves were in Essex Ravine.

Pte Dunphy was buried near Capt. Wright in Borderers Gulley, about 200 yards nearer the firing line in an authorized cemetery.

While you will feel the sense of loss and sorrow at the parting of a loved one, yet it will no doubt be some consolation that he died in defence of King and Country and for the establishment of the principles of Righteousness and Liberty which are so vital to the human race. Your gallant brother early obeyed the call and came forward with courage to do his part in this great struggle. Though he has now laid down the earthly weapons, he has assumed the soldier's Crown of Victory and his name will be inscribed upon the glorious Roll of Honour and be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow-countrymen. We are proud to have such gallant men and proud of the mothers and fathers that have so nobly and unselfishly given them when the call of duty came. Your brother died nobly facing the foe and it will be a pleasure to you in years to come to think that he bore no small part in bringing about the establishment of righteousness and abiding peace.


