He was traced as far as the Main Corps Dressing Station, Sorrel, but after that there is a blank. Nor do we even know the extent of his wounds. We have already received 24 enquiries from Government Depts, and private people, but are unable to locate poor old John. We are still hot on his trail and doing everything possible to find him. I hope he is not badly wounded.






