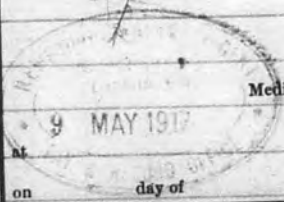



Referring to your letter of recent date, regarding monies due to your late son, I beg to advise that a soldier's pay ceases on the day of his death. In cases where the soldiers had made allotments in favour of parents, these allotments were, at the instruction of the Government, continued for a period. Your claim for the 50¢ per day cannot therefore, be entertained.

With regard to War Service Gratuity of \$70.00 per month, I beg to advise that this is not payable on account of men who have died whilst in the service. The Gratuity is simply a grant made to men who have been discharged, to help them ~~exist~~ for a reasonable period, and to enable them to re-establish themselves in civil life.

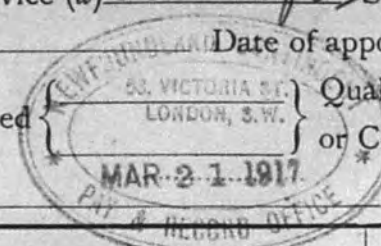
