Dear Madam,

It was with extreme regret that the Government received a message from the Record Office, London, intimating that your son, Private John M. Fitzgerald, had, on the 1st December, made the supreme sacrifice, laying down his life in defence of his King and Country.

On behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, I desire to express to you the sincerest sympathy in your time of sorrow. But though we feel the parting and though the heart is heavy with its loss, yet it is a glorious thing to think that your gallant boy early responded to the call of duty and made his stand for the establishment of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty upon the earth. We are all proud of our brave and noble boys but no less do we esteem the unselfish fathers and mothers who so willingly gave their lads when the call of duty came. Though your boy has laid down his earthly weapons he wears the soldier's Crown of Victory and his name is inscribed upon the glorious Roll of Honour and will be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow countrymen. When the end of this war comes and an honourable and abiding Peace will have been established, it will be your proud thought that your dear boy did to the utmost of his ability to bring about such result. I trust that the Great Father may give you of His love and comfort at this time.





I am in receipt of your letter of the 7th inst, asking for further information on this matter. In reply I would state that presumably notification of casualties are not sent to Hfld in the same manner as in Canada. The routine in connection with our casualties, is that they are reported by the War Office to the Paymaster & Officer in charge of Records of the 1st. Newfoundland Regiment at London, who forwards copies of lists to the Governor here, which later come into my hands, to be filed for reference.


I might state that, in the original cable covering these casualties, the christian name or the initials are not given, and in the case of Private Fitzgerald, I notice from copy of a letter received from the War Office, by our Record Office in London, that No. 295 was originally initialed J.L. Fitzgerald, but changed in our London Office to J.M. Fitzgerald. This is the only official notice that we have.

I trust that my letter of yesterday and the present one will be sufficient for your Head Office to clear up the matter.

If not too great an inconvenience, you might ask them to allow the Imperial Life insurance Company the use of this correspondence, as they also carried Fitzgerald as a risk, and are looking for similar information.




