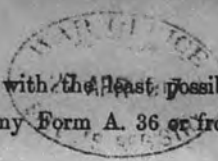

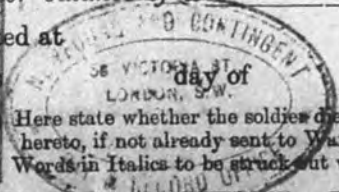



I beg to state in reply to your enquiries regarding this Form that, although the grave of your son has not up to the present time been registered, it is possible that it may yet be located by the D.G.R.&B. whose efforts in endeavouring to locate the missing bodies and graves of soldiers, are still in progress. In the event of Private Fitzgerald's grave being located it will be removed into another cemetery, and a Memorial Cross will be erected in his memory. The Form in your possession refers to this Memorial, on which a space is reserved for a personal inscription of the next of kin. The pattern of the Memorial for men classed as missing has not yet been decided on, but in any case, it is likely that the same space will be reserved as on that of the Cross for a personal inscription, and I should be glad, therefore, if you will complete the attached Form, filling in the space marked (A)
