Dear Madam,

It was with extreme regret that the Government received a telegram from the Record Office, London, intimating that your son, No. 1904, Private Alphonsus Fitzpatrick, had died on the 9th January in the Hospital at Ayr of pneumonia, measles and asthenia. Permit me to express to you, on behalf of the Government as well as for myself, the sincerest sympathy in your sorrow. One cannot too deeply mourn the loss of such a brave soldier, but there is consolation in knowing that he did his duty honestly and well and gave his life for the cause of Liberty and the upholding of the Empire. Though he has now laid down his earthly weapons, he has assumed the crown of victory as a soldier who died in the defence of his country.

We are proud to have such brave young men, and we rejoice also that we have such noble fathers and mothers who so willingly give up their sons when the call of King and Country comes to them. When the fight has been won and the reign of Peace and Truth and Righteousness has again been established upon earth, it will be no small comfort to you to realize that your brave boy did all he could in order to bring this about. His name will be inscribed upon the glorious Roll of Honour, and be held in fragrant memory by all his countrymen.

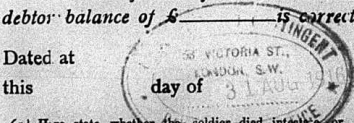

In the case of a Particular Search, the applicant must indicate a particular name or entry; while in the case of a General Search, he does not require to specify the object of such search. Every Extract of any Entry in the Register Books, kept under the provisions of the Registration Acts (17 & 18 Vict. c. 80, 18 Vict. c. 29, and 23 & 24 Vict. c. 85), duly authenticated and signed, is admissible as evidence in all parts of His Majesty's dominions without any other proof of such Entry.

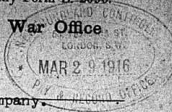
