STATEMENT OF PRISONER OF WAR.

#2280, L/Cpl. W.J. Frampton - 38 Powerscourt, Signal Hill Rd.,

Enlisted March 20th, 1916 - Preceded Overseas Jany. 1916.

Company in France - "B" Company.

Place & Date of Capture - Monchy-le-Preux, 4th April 1917.

Circumstances of Capture - While advancing on enemy trenches on the morning of April 4th, 1917 we were completely surrounded and being short of ammunition were forced to surrender about 10 a.m.

Details of Life & Treatment under Capture - After our capture we were taken to a small village behind the lines about 3 kilometers, we remained at this place until 2 o'clock in the afternoon when we were formed up and marched to Douai. After arrival in Douai we were given something to eat, it consisted of 1 loaf of bread and a bucket of water between fourteen men. We remained in Douai for fourteen days during our time in this place we were asked many questions concerning the Allied troops. We were also relieved of our personal effects while there. Our food consisted of bread for breakfast about 2 ounces to a man, for dinner and tea we received a very light soup. Our quarters were in an old French Barracks we were quartered in one large room with 200 men, the floor was spread with excelsior for bedding from the time of our confinement in this Barracks up to the time we left it had not been cleaned out once, complaints were made to those in charge, but, to no avail as there only answer was that the German prisoners were receiving the same treatment at the hands of the Allies.

After leaving Douai we went by train to Lille where we were quartered in Fort MacDonald, in a room about 30 X 60 feet, 150 men were put in this room, there was only one small window the walls, ceiling and floor were made of concrete, conditions in this room were frightful, no sanitary arrangements whatever. For food we got a small piece of bread for breakfast and sour soup for dinner, after which we received no food until about 8 o'clock next morning, we drank our soup from our soup from our Steel Helmets. The treatment meted out to us here was much worse

than that which we received at Douai.

We remained in Lille for about ten days when we were sent to a Village called Guesnain, here we were put to work digging a light railway, we worked from 5 a.m. in the morning until 5 p.m. in the afternoon, after which we were escorted to a half finished house, in this house was only the ground floor were 400 men slept.

We remained in Guesnain 2 months after which we were sent to Germany to a prison camp called Dulman in West Whillhm, in this Camp were men of all the Allied Nations, the food was much the same as that received by us at Lille, on the whole the treatment received at this Camp was very good, in fact much ahead of the treatment received by us at our previous stopping places. While here we were told by a German Officer wall up in the English language that we were to be kept at this camp until we were starved to death. After leaving this Camp leaving this Camp about July 1917 we were sent to Hilsburg in East Prussia here I was sent to live with a German Farmer, this man treated me as if I was his son, getting plenty of food from him as well as receiving parcels from England regularly. I was working on this farm until the latter part of November 1918.

I Left Hilsburg for England via Dansig a German serport town and arrived in Leith in Scotland by a Danish boat Dec.9th, 1919.

After our capture we were taken to a small village behind the lines about 3 kilometers. we remained at this place until 2 o'clock in the afternoon when we were formed up and marched to Sauai. After arrival in Sauai we were given something to eat, it consisted of 1 Loaf of bread and a bucket of water between fourteen men. We remained in Sauai for fourteen days during our time in this place we were asked many questions concerning the allied troops. We were also relieved of our personal effects while there. Our food consisted of bread for breakfast about 2 ounces to a man, for dinner. and tea we received a very light soup. Our quarters were in an old French Barracks we were quartered in one large room with 200 men. the floor was spread with excelsior for bedding. from the

time of our confinement in this barracks up to the time we left it had not been cleaned out once. Complaints were made to those in charge, but to no avail as there only answer was that the German prisoners were receiving the same treatment at the hands of the Allies.

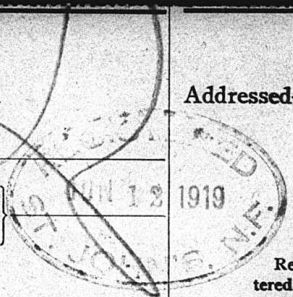

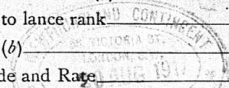
