About one month ago I applied to the Department of External Affairs, Ottawa, for a renewal of my Passport, but they could not issue me a new Passport until I produced a copy of my Birth Certificate. I then applied to the Deputy Registrar-General, Halifax, for a Birth Certificate, but as there were no facilities for registering births at Argyle, Nova Scotia, where I was born, in 1893, the Registrar-General requires supporting evidence of one character and another, which I am finding it difficult to obtain.


Possibly a copy of my Attestation Papers when I enlisted in 1914 would be helpful. I was attested in late August or early September, 1914, at St. John's, Newfoundland, and joined the Royal Newfoundland Regiment. I was then a private soldier and my Regimental Number was 58.

I presume the Attestation Papers would be in my file in the Archives, Ottawa, probably in the officer section, as I was later commissioned and was retired in 1919 with the Rank of Captain.

Would you be good enough to have my file drawn and if the Attestation document is located would it be asking too much to have a photocopy made, assuming the original cannot be released - and forwarded to me.

Dear Colonel Ralston:

While my personal acquaintance with you is very slight - having met you only once, in Edmonton some years ago - I am taking the liberty of writing you, believing that you may be of assistance in directing my services into channels where they could be utilized to the maximum in the prosecution of the war.

I am 48 years of age, was born in Argyle, Yarmouth County, entered the Bank of Nova Scotia in 1908, enlisted in 1914 with the Royal Newfoundland Regiment attached to the 9th and 29th Divisions, commissioned in 1916, served as Captain and company commander from March 1918 to June 1919. After demobilization, I rejoined the Bank and have since served successively as assistant manager at St. John's Newfoundland and Winnipeg, manager at Saskatoon and Saint John and now Supervisor at Head Office, Toronto.

When the Reserve Army was reorganized in July 1940, I was commissioned as temporary Major in the Saint John Fusiliers, 2nd Bn., and upon being moved to Toronto by the Bank last September, I transferred to the Royal Regiment of Canada, 2nd Bn., reverting to Captain, there being no vacancy for my temporary rank.

Although I am in medical category A, heretofore due to family obligations, which among other things involved the serious illness of my wife and financing my eldest son at Royal Military College, I was not in a position to enlist, but I am now prepared and ask to serve in an active military capacity, in Canada or elsewhere.

With my long experience in business organization and supervision, and previous army service, I am convinced that I could very soon qualify for a post of military responsibility where a greater contribution in national service could be made than is possible in the position I now hold.

Any one of the gentlemen whose names I have listed on the attached sheet, would be glad I feel sure to vouch for my character and ability. An official record of my service in the last war is also appended.

Dear Sir:-

Will you kindly advise me if the Government of Newfoundland redeems at par, such Sterling Funds as represent the Pay and Allowances of a Newfoundland soldier, at present deposited with the Bank of Montreal in London.

I have at my credit something over £150 with the Bank of Montreal, London, representing Pay and Allowances from the Newfoundland Regiment, which funds I have been unable to draw without a considerable loss, on account of the abnormal low rate of Sterling Exchange.

I have been advised by the Department of Militia and Defence of Canada, that they redeem such funds at par for Canadian soldiers. As all Pay and Allowances in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment were based entirely upon the Canadian scale, I trust that a like arrangement has been effected with regard to Pay and Allowances not yet withdrawn from the Bank of Montreal, London.

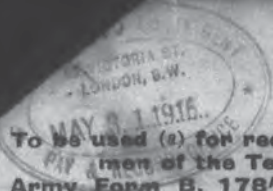

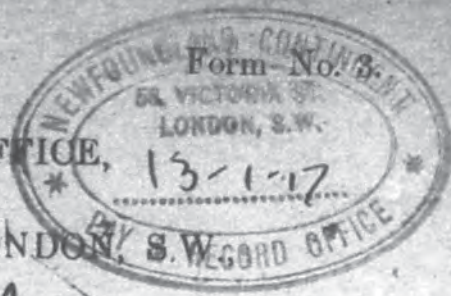

"out of the line" or when I was "on leave", I sent monies to
my mother in the most convenient form. The largest remittance
was effected in the early part of 1917, when I sent her my
personal cheque on the Bank of Montreal, London, for £100.
Most of the other amounts were £5 and £10, and averaged the
equivalent of between \$20 and \$25 per month. As near as we
can tell at present, up to the time of making my Allotment, I
had sent her approximately \$1100, made up as follows:-
£45 by Post Office Order, £120 by cheque, and \$315 by Bank
draft.

(Dept. of Militia, cont'd).

If I remember correctly, the Separation Allowance application papers, now in the hands of the Paymaster, stated \$1000, but we now find this amount was a little exceeded.

I trust the above is the information required, and that the explanation is clear. I regret engaging your department with this and previous correspondence, and would not solicit your attention on a matter of less importance, but I have found that acknowledgements of my letters to the Paymaster's office have been subjected to constant delays. I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 7th instant respecting extension of leave for Lieutenant G.S. Frost (1st Newfoundland Regiment) now at Yarmouth, N.S. on account of wounds received in action.

On the report of the Medical Board convened at Windsor, N.S. under direction of Major Montgomerie, this gallant officer has been granted extension of leave for three months, expiring on May 23rd. I have telegraphed to Major Montgomerie, Lieutenant Frost and the Pay and Record Office to that effect.

It appears to me that Mr. Frost's disability is sufficiently serious to warrant reasonable grounds for believing that he will be unfit to resume active service.

I am therefore desiring him to come to St. John's on or before the expiry of his leave to undergo his next medical examination. If he should then be held to be unfit for further active service he could be placed in the reserve of officers, be granted his pension and enabled to return to civil life. This course is preferable to sending him back to the Depot at Ayr at considerable delay and inconvenience to Mr. Frost and expense to the Colony.

A copy of this letter is enclosed to Lieut. Frost for his information and guidance; as well as to Major Montgomerie, and the Pay & Record Office in London.

Re Lieut. C. S. Frost.

In regard to the case of Lieut. Frost, respecting whom I am sending you an official communication under another cover, may I suggest to you that, if this officer's disability is sufficiently serious to warrant reasonable ground for believing that he will be unfit to resume active service, it might be better to direct him to come to St. John's and undergo his next medical examination, because in such a case, if held to be unfit, he could be discharged, given his pension, and returned at once to his civil employment, which was that of a bank clerk. If he goes back to Ayr he will probably be held there for some time, then boarded, went back via Quebec, the I.C.R., and the Reid railway to St. John's, and boarded again, and this will probably cause us an outlay of four or five hundred dollars, whereas if he were brought here direct from Yarmouth, it would only mean about \$50 altogether for his passage and board for a day or two, until discharge.

Of course I do not know what the nature of his injuries is and therefore cannot say whether this course would be the proper one, but I know you will give due consideration to the suggestion in the light of your own knowledge of the details of his case.

Re Second Lieut. Frank Bennett.

We had this officer's papers before us at a Pension Board meeting last night and decided to pass them on through Major Carty to you for his discharge, or, rather, transfer to the reserve of officers, which I understand is the official procedure of such cases, as he has been held by the doctors to be permanently unfit.

During the discussion of his case, Major Carty told us that Mr. Bennett, who is thus far on furlough, called to see

him two or three days ago and asked him if he could not put him on light duty, and Major Carty says he stated he could not do this as the doctors had held him to be permanently unfit and recommended his discharge; but it is apparent from this that this young man would naturally like to keep on nominal service and draw \$140 a month, instead of being discharged, more especially as Dr. Fraser states that the aggravation of his disability by active service is not sufficiently great to justify any pension or allowance. I would say, however, that my remarks in regard to Lieut. Carter's case apply in this instance also, but with even greater force, because whereas Carter was on active service and wounded, Bennett was never out of England, and seeing that we have already discharged Lieut. Lumsden, who was wounded with the Canadians, Lieut. Knight who was in the first of July fight; and Lieut. Burnham who, though he did not go beyond Ayr, claimed to be the only support of a widowed mother, it would, I think, leave the door open for very vigorous criticism if Lieut. Bennett were continued on duty at the rate of \$1680 a year under these circumstances.

I may add that the members of the Board were unanimous in the opinion that Major Carty had taken the proper step, and that Lieut. Bennett ~~had to~~ ^{should} be discharged and not retained.

I am emboldened to make these suggestions because of your saying in your last note to me regarding the Carter case, that you were pleased that I brought the Carter matter to your notice; and I make the above suggestions in the same spirit.
