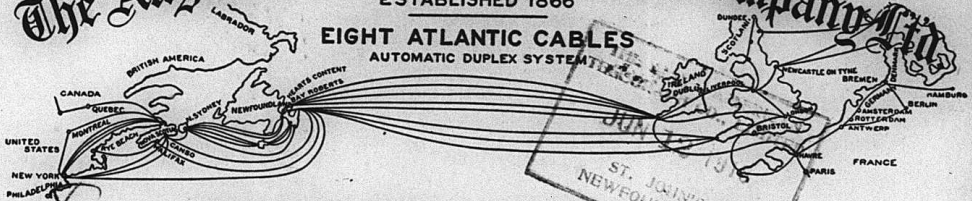

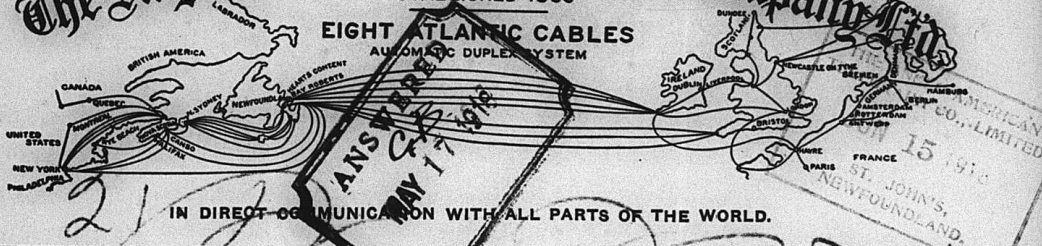

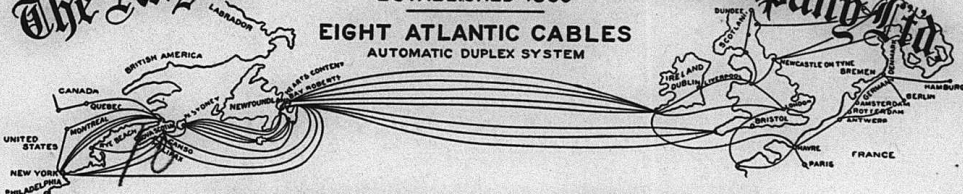

Dear Mrs. Keeping,

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 12th inst., in which you ask for full particulars with regard to the death of #5367 Pte. Chas. Fudge. The particulars of Pte. Fudge's illness and death are as follows:— He was taken ill with Measles, and later contracted Pneumonia. He was admitted to the Military Hospital, St. John's, on June 4th, and a few days afterwards, became dangerously ill. His illness with Measles had weakened him considerably, and he was unable to fight the Pneumonia. He died at 3.40 o'clock on the morning of June the 11th. Needless to say he received every possible attention during his illness, and everything possible was done by the nurses and doctors.

Those are all the particulars available to us, and I hope they will prove satisfactory.
