Sir,

With reference to your letter 68/3 of the 25th January, and a request that Capt. Gane should be re-examined at an early date, I am directed to inform you that it will be possible to examine Capt. Gane in London as requested by the Board of Pension Commissioners, Newfoundland.

I am, however, to point out that the expense of bringing Capt. Gane to London will be considerable; it will probably cost about £15.

I am further to point out that the Board which examined Capt. Gane in Glasgow was the best Board obtainable, and had upon it a Deputy Commissioner of Medical Services, a Surgical Specialist and a Special Assessor as well as an ordinary member. The assessment given by that Board would not appear to be at all excessive in view of the disability from which Capt. Gane is suffering. If Capt. Gane is brought to London a Board similarly constituted will examine him here.

In the circumstances I am to ask if you will inform me whether the Board of Pension Commissioners, Newfoundland still require Capt. Gane to be examined in London.

Reference enclosed allotment forms. Is this essential? reference regulations governing the issue of Separation allowance, para. 15, which stated, "Should he object, and submit reasons for his objections, it will be decided whether the assignment shall be continued or not".

The reason I ask this is, if my Pay is reduced 50% this will be rather tight for me to get along here, also this is not essential to my wife, together with the Separation Allowance.
