

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 6th inst. in which you make application for home furlough for #2305 Pte. Thos. H. Gardner.

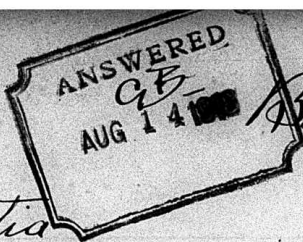

This is 2305 Pte Thomas E. Gardner.

I kindly ask if it is possible that he could be granted furlough to return home for a time. i.e. if he wish to return to visit us. My only sons of age is serving one in the Navy since October 1914. the second in the Army, name above mentioned, in France since October 1916. I would be very glad if it was at all possible if my request could be granted.
