"On October 14/19 at SLYPS-CAPEELLE, L/C. Gardner was in charge of the advanced Echelon of Transport consisting of S.S.A. Bombs and Stokes Mortars which were to follow closely behind the attacking waves. This convoy consisted of G.S. wagons, limbered and Pack Cops. When the attack started the enemy put down a heavy barrage on the area where the convoy was. L/C. Gardner with great presence of mind, hitched up and galloped forward through the barrage bringing his convoy with him, thus saving it and keeping in touch with the attacking troops. He thus showed remarkable gallantry and devotion to duty whilst setting a noble example to his men."


