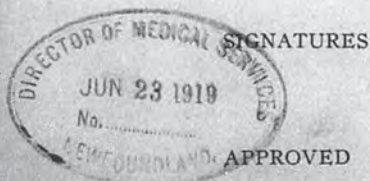

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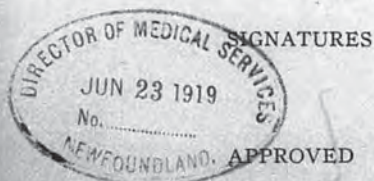

Some modification will be worked into the payment of this allowance, and, possibly, eventually your case may be favourable considered. I would ask you, therefore, to allow the matter to stand for the present.

Dear Mr. Squires:-

With reference to the letter in this morning's Daily News signed by Lieut. C.F. Garland, I should like to refer to one or two points which he raises.

It is noted that this letter is addressed to all members of the Great War Veterans' Association and it contains some statements which are not in accordance with facts. I understand from Dr. Blackall that he has been instructed by Mr. Justice Kent, Chairman of the Civil Re-Establishment Committee, to write a letter for publication correcting certain of the statements made in the letter referred to.

With reference to paragraph 2, payments made by the Canadian D.S.C.R. were of course refunded to them by the Newfoundland Government through this Department.

With reference to paragraph 3, by Minute of Council dated August 5th, 1918, payment to men undergoing vocational training was authorized at the same rate as was paid to men who were total disability pensioners; i.e. \$50.00 per month. No allowance was paid for dependents. By Minute of Council dated 20th Nov., 1918, the scale of payment to men and their dependents was graded as follows:-

- (a) For a man \$50.00 per month
- (b) For a wife \$20.00 " "
- (c) For a wife and one child \$26.00
- (d) " " " " two children \$32.00
- (e) " " " " three " \$38.00
- (f) " " " " four and more \$44.00

By Minute of Council of 12th June, 1919 authority was issued to increase the payment to men to \$50.00 per month.

There is no knowledge of any promise of the late Government to make allowances for Vocational training equal to the Canadians. Letter from this Department asking for this question to be considered was addressed on the 9th Dec., 1919, and is at present under consideration of the Government.

With reference to paragraph 4, the only letters that have come to my notice so far are the three concerning which I have already reported; namely Milley, Doran and Tracy. Mr. Garland's statements in this paragraph are a little wide.

With reference to paragraph 5, I would say that until recently none of the Civil Re-Establishment Committee were members of the G.W.V.A. Major Butler has

recently been added. It is likely that the G.W.V.A. will have some remarks to make in reply to Mr. Garland's insinuations in this paragraph.

With reference to paragraph 6, you are already acquainted with the facts concerning Milley's case.

With reference to paragraph 7, the first part of this is absolutely incorrect. With reference to the part of the paragraph referring to salaries, there is no member of the Civil Re-Establishment Committee who is in receipt of any remuneration or emolument for his work on that Committee. The whole paragraph is false.

With reference to paragraph 8, this shows the scale of payments referred to in my letter of Dec. 9th, 1919.

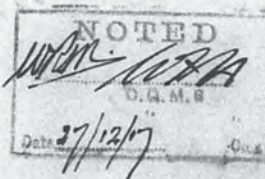

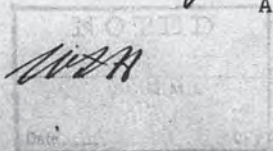

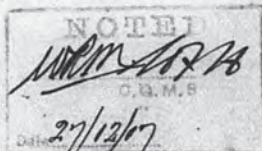
