The above named soldier, who has recently been in St. John's, on furlough, has applied for transfer to The Royal Newfoundland Regiment. It is understood that he is a fully qualified dentist, and in accordance with the practice in dealing with professional men, he is eligible for a commission.

The Director of Medical Services is anxious to procure the services of a dental man, and recommends his transfer, if it is approved at your end. Would it be possible to carry out his discharge from the Canadian Dental Corps, on the understanding that he should proceed at once to this country, and be guaranteed a commission in The Royal Newfoundland Regiment, or could he be gazetted as Lieutenant in the Canadian Dental Corps, and his transfer take place at once? Either of these cases would be preferable, and the alternative will be to have him transferred as a private, in which case he would have to work his way through the ranks, though it is possible that his promotion would *be* accelerated.

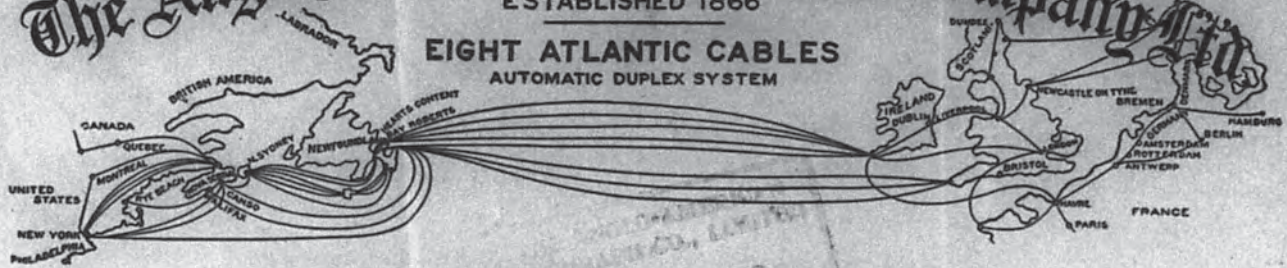

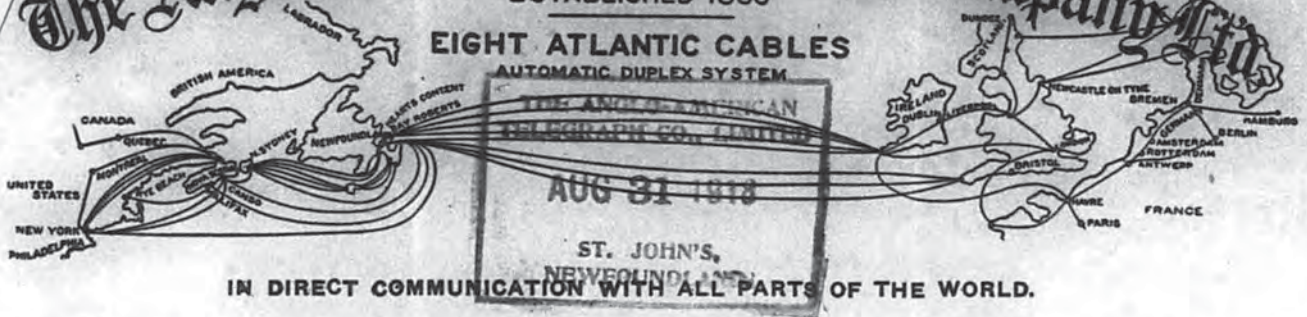

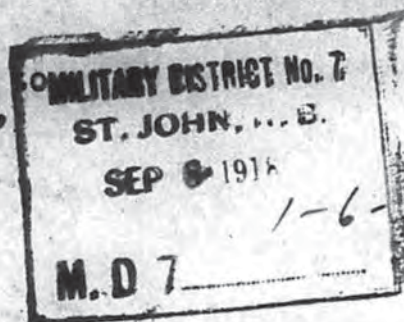

5734. Cpl. H. Lehr and Lieut. Gear

These men both graduated together this spring from Baltimore College of Dental Surgery. Lehr went to the United States to take some further examinations; Gear went to Canada and enlisted. Gear came back here as a private on home leave. While here he applied for transfer to Newfoundland, with a Commission. As the need for Dental work was very great his request was granted and he has been duly transferred.

Shortly after our request had gone forward to the Canadian Authorities for this transfer, and permission been granted by them Lehr showed up and enlisted in our own forces. The Depot was communicated with but did not seem to want a dentist. Gear is now here and I am having him make a survey of the condition of the men's teeth at the Depot. From what I can gather thus far there will be ample work for two dentists over a considerable period, but feel that it would be better to defer further action for a few days pending completion of Gear's report.


