Gellately, are now both in St. John's Nfld. and that I received the letter referred to, and addressed it as under. I understand that my wife sent a letter to the Paymaster 1st Newfoundland Regiment at St. John's, informing him of her change in address, but yesterday I received a letter from my wife informing me that Mr. A. Gellately had not received any money from the Regiment since that which I sent from her, which proves that the letter I readdressed reached them safely, but as no money has reached here since, and none has been received at St. John's up to December 3rd, on which date my wife's letter was written, can you inform me the reason of stoppage of money. Could you also inform me of the present whereabouts of my brother in law No. 100, Pte. W. Gellately, as I have not heard from him for about two months, neither has her people at St. John's, and in the event of any injury happening to him, whether I could also be informed as well as his people in St. John's. I should be glad Sir, if you could favour me with a reply.

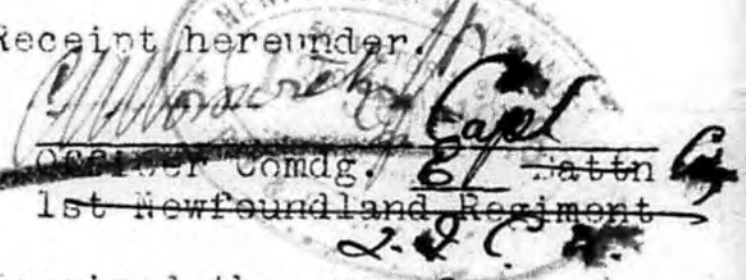

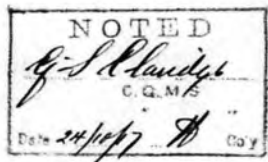

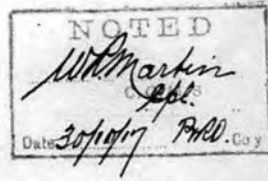

The following is a copy of an Order in Council dated April  
1st/19:-

Under the provisions of the War Measures Act, 1914-16 it is ordered that any person who is or has been a member of His Majesty's Forces during the present War and who has suffered from any venereal disease, and who may still be suffering from the effects of said disease may, on the certificate of the Medical or Acting Medical Health Officer setting forth the nature of the disease and recommending aggregation be arrested by any Peace Officer and placed in the Military Hospital at St. John's and there detained until pronounced cured by a certificate of the Medical or Acting Medical Health Officer, or the Medical Superintendent or the physician in charge of said Hospital.

Any person so detained who escapes from the said Hospital, or who refuses to comply with the rules and regulations of said Hospital, or any person who aids another in escaping from said Hospital, shall be guilty of a breach of this Order and liable on summary conviction to a fine of One thousand Dollars and in default of payment to one year's imprisonment."

Could you also inform me of the present whereabouts of my brother in law No. 100, Pte. W. Gallately, as I have not heard from him for about two months, neither has her people at St. John's, and in the event of any injury happening to him, whether I could also be informed as well as his people in St. John's. I should be glad Sir, if you could favour me with a reply.



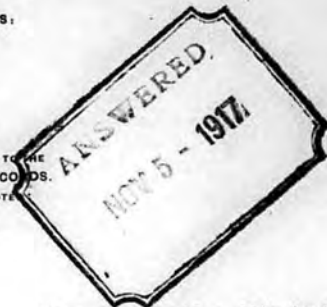
