Your letter of the 30th Oct. received, in which you ask me to complete the Separation Allowance Paper of Mrs. Jessie Sparks.

I was about to do the work to-day, but found that the trip would entail 94 miles travelling by rail, and a stay over for a day. On reflection I decided to lay these facts before you.

Lower Island Cove is nearly ~~two~~ at the extreme east end of Bay-de-Verde, and I think you have Upper Island Cove, District of Harbor Grace, and some eight miles away, confounded with the residence ^{free} of Mrs. Sparks.

I would go if I knew definitely if you wish me to do so, for any special reason.

If you so wish me a telegram to that effect will send me on the way promptly.

Mr. Alan G. Hudson is a Justice of the Peace and resides in Lower Island Cove.

Late Ernest Gill: Mrs. Shⁿners, aunt of this deceased soldier, has requested me to find out for her some facts about his estate. The mother of the soldier died lastfall, and since that time nothing is known by the aunt about the soldier's pay. Mrs. Shⁿners is a widow, and lived for a time, with her sister, Mrs. G Gill, and attended her during Mrs. Gill's illness. The father of the soldier is alive, living in Lisbon Falls, Maine, U.S.A. He has been there for years, but it seems that he deserted his wife and child here, and took up with another woman in Lisbon Falls. There is also a daughter married in Sydney, that is a sister of the soldier, but she was taken by the father when an infant and never lived with the mother.

Would you let me know if the late Private Ernest Gill has named any one as next-of-kin since the mother died? Mrs. Shⁿners thinks she should get the money, but I have informed her that no one will get anything until administration is had, and that if she has any claims against the estate the administrator is the one to settle such claims.
