Dear Mr. Peters:-

I am in receipt of your letter of July 3rd, having reference to No. 2584 Pte. Patrick Gillispie.

I have gone fully into this man's military record and find nothing to warrant the suspicion that he is suffering, or has suffered from the disease you mention. Gillispie was wounded on four different occasions, and was in hospital with diphtheria and tonsillitis, and his military record is good.

While in hospital suffering from wounds in June 1917, he voluntarily gave 450 cubic centimeters of his blood for transfusion to another patient in the same hospital. This, apart from being praiseworthy, shows that at that time his physical condition was as good as anybody's, because for such a transfusion an examination and analysis of his blood would be taken.

I have also had the medical records looked up to see if he received treatment since his discharge, but I am unable to find that he has. As far as I am able to say, you have no reason whatever to worry about Gillispie in connection with the point which you raised.
