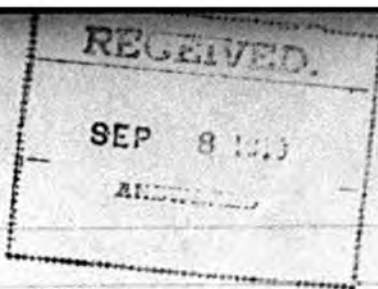

I joined the Army in 1916 I have been in several fights & in Cambrai. I was put out of Commission by Shrapnel in the leg so I consider myself entitled to some consideration as well as others.

Please let me know why I do not receive any pay as well as the other soldiers
