OPINION OF THE MEDICAL BOARD.

NOTES.—(i) Clear and definite answers are to be filled in by the Board, as, in the event of a man being invalided, it is essential that the Minister of Pensions should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable him to decide upon the man's claim to pension.

Expressions such as "may," "might," "probably," etc., are to be avoided.

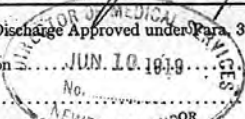

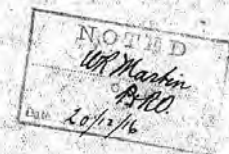

With reference to the enclosed. To the best of my knowledge L/Corp. Gladney was never on the strength of the Windsor Draft while it was at Windsor. As far as I can remember L/Corp. Gladney came up to Halifax with the Draft under command of Major Carty. Just previous to transport sailing Gladney was landed with diphtheria. He was in hospital three weeks and was then granted one week's furlough by the Officer i/c of the hospital and he proceeded to St. John, N. B. He arrived back in Halifax the day the Windsor Draft arrived from Windsor and he came over in one of the boats.

I am quite sure he never received any pay through the pay book of the Windsor Draft while it was at Windsor. He may have received a casual payment from Major Montgomerie at Halifax but I do not think he did. However Major Montgomerie would be able to say whether or not he had made him a casual payment. I think Gladney came over on the same ship as Major Montgomerie crossed over on. As you know the Windsor Draft was divided into three parts, each going on separate steamers. It might be possible that he received a casual payment coming over on the boat but this of course I am unable to state definitely.

With reference to the enclosed. To the best of my knowledge L/Cpl Gladney was never on the strength of the Windsor Draft while it was at Windsor. As far as I can remember L/Corp. Gladney came up to Halifax with the draft under command of Major Carty. Just previous to transport sailing Gladney was landed with Diphtheria. He was in Hospital three weeks and was then granted one weeks furlough by the Officer i/c of the Hospital and he proceeded to St. John's, N. B. He arrived back in Halifax the day the Windsor Draft arrived from Windsor and he came over in one of the boats.

I am quite sure he never received any pay through the Pay Book of the Windsor Draft while it was at Windsor. He may have received a casual payment from Major Montgomerie at Halifax but I do not think he did. However Major Montgomerie would be able to say whether or not he had made him a casual payment. I think Gladney came over on the same ship Major Montgomerie crossed over on. As you know the Windsor Draft was divided into three parts, each going on separate steamers. It might be possible that he received a casual payment coming over on the boat but this of course I am unable to state definitely.

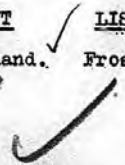
