I am credited with October pay £12:7:7 which I can understand, as I was a month in hospital, but I do not for November pay, which is only £7:9:0. Would you please let me know if there is not a mistake somewhere, or how long these stoppages are to go on. I might say when I first reported sick in November 1916, I could not get in Hospital, and had private treatment at my own expense, and when admitted to Aberdeen was only given a little treatment as they said I did not require it, and it was unfair to me to keep me there, and I always had a negative blood test. Surely stoppage of pay for the month I was in hospital, August 20th to September 20th, and in consideration of the expense I had while under private treatment not being able to have the advantage of the course given in such hospitals, ought to be sufficient without continuing same.

I do not consider it just and fair, for if I were suffering from the disease, why did the hospital discharge me without sufficient

treatment, and then the last board I had, stated the eczema I have has nothing to do with the disease. I was in a venereal hospital only a month and can't see why stoppages are still going on.

I would like an early reply, please, for if these stoppages are to continue I will be forced to resign, as I will fast drift into financial difficulties.

Appended is certificate from Capt. Johnson, R.A.M.C. who examined me at my last board in Ayr, and who knew my case from the start. You will see by this certificate that I suffered no disability through venereal disease though admitted to hospital for treatment last August.

The cause of my going there was due to a skin trouble resulting from scabies and impetigo contracted when in the trenches, and was put down as due to venereal the moment I stated I once had it. I received little treatment there, not half a course, and was discharged on a negative blood test that was taken before I received any treatment there at all.

When I told the M. O. what treatment I had previously received he said I must be cured by this time, and later said it was unfair to keep me there. 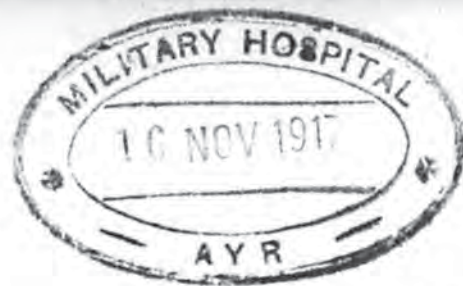

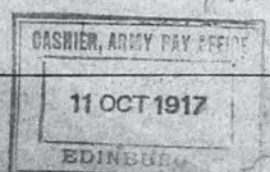



I am credited with October pay £12:7:7 which I can understand, as I was a month in hospital, but I do not for November pay, which is only £7:9:0. Would you please let me know if there is not a mistake somewhere, or how long these stoppages are to go on. I might say when I first reported sick in November 1916, I could not get in Hospital, and had private treatment at my own expense, and when admitted to Aberdeen was only given a little treatment as they said I did not require it, and it was unfair to me to keep me there, and I always had a negative blood test. Surely stoppage of pay for the month I was in hospital, August 20th to September 20th, and in consideration of the expense I had while under private treatment not being able to have the advantage of the course given in such hospitals, ought to be sufficient without continuing same.

I do not consider it just and fair, for if I were suffering from the disease, why did the hospital discharge me without sufficient

treatment, and then the last board I had, stated the eczema I have has nothing to do with the disease. I was in a venereal hospital only a month and can't see why stoppages are still going on.

I would like an early reply, please, for if these stoppages are to continue I will be forced to resign, as I will fast drift into financial difficulties.

Appended is certificate from Capt. Johnson, R.A.M.C. who examined me at my last board in Ayr, and who knew my case from the start. You will see by this certificate that I suffered no disability through venereal disease though admitted to hospital for treatment last August.

The cause of my going there was due to a skin trouble resulting from scabies and impetigo contracted when in the trenches, and was put down as due to venereal the moment I stated I once had it. I received little treatment there, not half a course, and was discharged on a negative blood test that was taken before I received any treatment there at all.

When I told the M. O. what treatment I had previously received he said I must be cured by this time, and later said it was unfair to keep me there. I had treatment in December 1916 in Edinburgh, at my own expense, as I could not get in Hospital at the time, which far exceeded stoppages I would have incurred for a full course in an hospital. In May 1917, I had a negative blood test, another in June in Yorkhill Hospital, and a third in Aberdeen (1st Scottish General Hospital) in August.

Captain Gracie, M.O. of Yorkhill Hospital, when boarding me in July 1917, said as far as he was concerned I hadn't the disease, as I gave a negative blood test, yet he put it on my sheets, thus causing all the trouble and resulting in my going to Aberdeen. Surely that was a piece of injustice, simply because I stated I once had it. He knew the treatment I received for it, and also the cause of the eczematous condition of my skin, I am still suffering from eczema. I reported the disease as soon as I discovered it, received immediate and efficient treatment and gave these negative blood tests before treatment in a venereal hospital, and therefore claim stoppages as I was not suffering from venereal disease when admitted to the 1st Scottish General Hospital, Aberdeen.

He was at once put under anti syphilitic treatment in Edinburgh. I am of opinion that he never suffered any disability from this disease and that his unfitness for duty was fit to the eczematous condition of his skin, and to that only, and that this eczema was unaffected by the syphilitic infections.

Reference attached: This officer was admitted here on 21/8/17 with a history in syphilis in 1916, and a course of salvarsan and H. G. On admission he had a general enlargements of glands and a scaly eezematuous condition of pabis andperimacum, but no other signs.

On consultation with Major Geddie R.A.M.C. we decided that this was a fairly characteristic secondary manifestation after salvarsan treatment, in spite of the fact that his Wassermann reaction was negative on 24/8/17. Here he had 1.8 grns. of Saly 1. spread over five doses and five grns H. G. intramuscularly, and his eezematous condition improved to a considerable degree.

On 21/9/17 he was discharged from Hospital, with the council that with ordinary ease and cleanliness his now latent condition of his perimacum would cause him no trouble. Whatever the origin of his eezema it was undoubtedly aggravated by his Metic injection. This also was the opinion of Major Geddie, please.

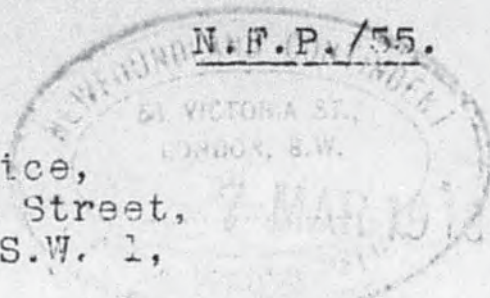

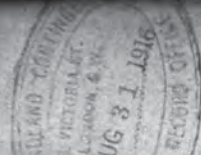


