Dear Mrs. Goodland:-

With reference to the matter of effects belonging to your late son, No. 4186, Pte. A. Goodland, I might say that the fullest enquiries have been made by our Pay & Record Office, London with an endeavour to locate the personal belongings of Pte. Goodland but have proved to be unavailing. The Officer Commanding 1st Battalion states in answer to application for information that no effects were recovered, the Battalion being constantly on the move in Oct. last when Pte. Goodland died of wounds, and communication with Rear Headquarters was very difficult and very frequently impossible. It is regretted that fuller information cannot now be obtained, as practically all other ranks who might be able to give information, and who were with their units at that time, have been demobilised and repatriated.

With further reference to your enquiry regarding your late brother and to my letter of 3/4/19: I beg to inform you that I have since heard from the Rev. J.W. Hope, C.F., 32nd Bn. M.G.C., B.E.F. The following is a quotation from his letter:

"14/4/19.

"Reference your copy of your No. 1181/1/R...C. dated 21/1/19 and your reminder 3617/2/R.&.C. dated 6/3/1919, both of which I received to-day. I have records that I buried 4186 Pte. A. Goodland at Waterdamhoek 26/E 21 d 4.3 on 14/10/1918. I wrote to his people and sent them his effects and told them all I could about his death. He was not disfigured and died soon after his admission to a Collecting Post. I was not with him when he died. I had gone forward I remember, and I came back to bury him and two others, having ordered some German prisoners to carry Pte. Goodland to the Cemetery.

Your first letter did not reach me and your second has been chasing me as I have twice changed my unit since leaving the 26th Brigade.

One of the M.Os. who attended to Pte. Goodland was afterwards killed and I buried him, and the other I believe has returned home to South Africa."

Dear Mrs. Goodland :-

With reference to my letter of Feb. 1st having reference to your son, the late No. 4186 Private A. Goodland, I beg to say that communication has been received from the Record Office, London stating that no effects belonging to Private Goodland had reached that Office, but an enquiry has been made to ascertain if any can be found or not. They have also asked the Director General of Graves and Effects to furnish a photograph of the Grave, if possible, which will be sent to you if it should be received here.

We are also advised by the Pay & Record Office, London that, although the fullest enquiries have been made regarding the death of Private Goodland they have proved to be unavailing. The authority for his death was a report made by the Burial Officer 26th Brigade, B.E.F. This Officer was written to on 31st Jan., but no reply has yet been received from him, and it is probable that he is the only person who can furnish any particulars. If any information is received from this Officer, it will be forwarded to us, and we in turn shall be glad to communicate same to you

I attach copy of letter from the mother of the above mentioned soldier under date of January 29th, and I shall be glad to know any further information concerning the death of this soldier can be obtained, please.

Minister of Militia

Enquiries had already been made regarding the death of Pte. Goodland, but it is regretted that up till now they have proved unavailing. The matter was referred in December last to the O.C. 1st Bn. and to the 3rd Echelon, neither of whom could throw any light on Pte. Goodland's death. Authority for his death was the report made by Burial Officer 26th Brigade, B.E.F. This Officer was written to on 21/1/19, but no reply has yet been received, and it is probable that he is the only person who could give any particulars.

Pte. Goodland was missing on 13/10/18 and was buried shortly after by the B.O. 26th Brigade. The official report states that he was "Killed in Action or Died of Wounds on or shortly after 13/10/18."

For your information I enclose copy of my No. 20728/89/R.&C. of 1918 exchanged with the 3rd Echelon; copy of this was sent to you on 21/1/19, but may have gone astray in the post. See also my telegram No. 443 of 20/1/19.

As advised on Casualty Report No. 207 of 1919, Pte. Goodland was buried at Waterdamhoek, S.E. of Passchendale, grave not registered. This information was got from the D.G.G.R. & E. in reply to an enquiry from this Office. D.G.G.R. & E. have been asked to furnish a photograph if possible, which will be sent to you should it be received here.

I also enclose copy of my No. 1179/4/R.&C. exchanged with 3rd Echelon. No effects belonging to Pte. Goodland have reached this Office, but an enquiry has been put out to ascertain if any can be found or not.

It is regretted that a more satisfactory answer cannot be given, please.

Enquiries had already been made regarding the death of Pte. Woodland, but it is regretted that up till now they have proved unavailing. The matter was referred in December last to the O.C. 1st Bn. and to the 3rd Echelon, neither of whom could throw any light on Pte. Goodland's death. Authority for his death was the report made by Burial Officer 26th Brigade, B. E. F. This Officer was written to on 21/1/19, but no reply has yet been received, and it is probable that he is the only person who could give any particulars.

Pte. Goodland was missing on 13/10/18 and was buried shortly after by the B.O. 26th Brigade. The official report states that he was "Killed in Action or Died of Wounds on or shortly after 13/10/18."

For your information I enclose copy of my No. 20728/89/R.&.C. of 1918 exchanged with the 3rd Echelon; copy of this was sent to you on 21/1/19, but may have gone astray in the post. See also my telegram No. 34 of 20/1/19.

As advised on Casualty report No. 207 of 1919, Pte. Goodland was buried at Waterdamhoek, S.E of Passchendale, grave not registered. This information was got from the D.G.G.R. & E. in reply to an enquiry from this Office.

B.G. G.R. & E. have been asked to furnish a photograph if possible, which will be sent to you should it be received here.

I also enclose copy of my No. 1179/4/R.&.C. exchanged with 3rd Echelon. No effects belonging to Pte. Goodland have reached this Office, but an enquiry has been put out to ascertain if any can be found or not.

It is regretted that a more satisfactory answer cannot be given, please.



Enquiries had already been made regarding the death of Pte. Goodland, but it is regretted that up till now they have proved unavailing. The matter was referred in December last to the O.C. 1st Bn. and to the 3rd Echelon, neither of whom could throw any light on Pte. Goodland's death. Authority for his death was the report made by Burial Officer 26th Brigade, B. E. F. This Officer was written to on 21/1/19, but no reply has yet been received, and it is probable that he is the only person who could give any particulars.

Pte. Goodland was missing on 13/10/18 and was buried shortly after by the B.O. 26th Brigade. The official report states that he was killed in Action or Died of Wounds on or shortly after 13/10/18.

For your information I enclose copy of my No. 20728/89/R.&.C. of 1918 exchanged with the 3rd Echelon; copy of this was sent to you on 21/1/19, but may have gone astray in the post. See also my telegram No. 34 of 20/1/19.

As advised on Casualty report No. 207 of 1919, Pte. Goodland was buried at Waterdamhoek, S.E. of Passchendale, grave not registered. This information was got from the D.G.G.R. & E. in reply to an enquiry from this Office.

D.G. G.R. & E. have been asked to furnish a photograph if possible, which will be sent to you should it be received here.

I also enclose copy of my No. 1179/4/R.&.C. exchanged with 3rd Echelon.

No effects belonging to Pte. Goodland have reached this Office, but an enquiry has been put out to ascertain if any can be found or not.

It is regretted that a more satisfactory answer cannot be given, please.





With reference to your enquiry regarding your late brother, it is regretted that although searching enquiries have been made concerning him, up till now they have proved unavailing. Authority for his death in the first place was a report made by the Burial Officer, 26th Household Brigade, and it is understood he wrote to Pte. Goodland's mother regarding his death. I have endeavoured to get in touch with the Officer in question, but have been unable to do so. Apparently he has since left the army.

Pte. Goodland was reported "Missing" 13/10/18, and was buried shortly after by the 26th Brigade. Official report states he was "Killed in Action or Died of Wounds on or shortly after 13/10/18," and no details whatever were given. He was buried at Waterdamhoek, S.E. of Passchendale, but his grave was not registered, hence the Director General of Graves Registration and Enquiries is unable to locate the grave and get a photograph, which I am sure you would like to have. Pte. Goodland ~~was~~ evidently died during a time of strenuous fighting, at an advanced dressing station, and hence it is that so little information can be got regarding his death.

I regret I am unable to give you ~~a~~ more satisfactory information; should I eventually get any further news, I will communicate it to you.


