I was in charge of a party making the road between LANGEMARCK station and church on the night Tuesday, Oct 9th. About 6.30 pm the officer of the Newfoundland Regt in question passed me with one or two men and some horses, or mules, and asked me the direction to some place that I have forgotten. Shortly afterwards a shell burst close to LANGEMARCK church. I went along and found several men and horses knocked out. I found the body of an officer. I could not recognize him as he had been hit in the face, so I took off his collar badge which I could feel was not a Lincoln badge. I did not search him for effects, but it was reported to me that he had been searched and nothing found except a notebook, which was forwarded. His body was left there and was buried next day by my party immediately S of the church, by the side of the road. As far as I know he was buried in his belt. I know nothing of his

watch or ring.

Lieut Goodyear, my transport officer was killed at Langemark on the night 9/10th Oct. Pte: Strong, one of the men with him, states that he ^{himself} was 'knocked out' by the shell, but came to later, & early on the morning of 10th he found Lieut Goodyear's body but the watch, ring, & belt & revolver were missing. He only found his whip & spurs which he brought in.

I was unable to find any trace of subsequently of what became of his body, until I received a report from the 10th (S) Bn Lewis Regt. stating that they had buried his body, & forwarded his note book.

In reply to my memo marked I I received reply marked II which acknowledges that men of the 10th (S) Bn Lewis found & searched the body immediately after his death.

Lieut: Goodyear was known to be wearing a wrist watch, a gold ring, & a belt & revolver -

From the statement of O.C. 'C' Coy 10th Lewis it is only reasonable to suppose that these

articles must have been on the body
when they found it.

In the interests of stopping the looting of
the dead, which I have previously
reported, I should be glad if the matter
could be taken up.

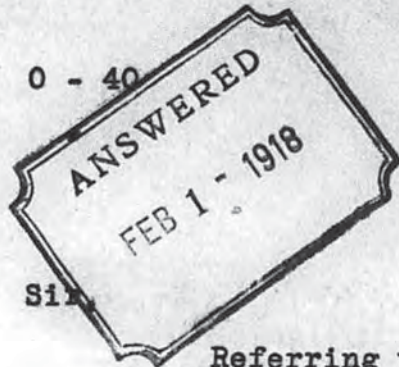



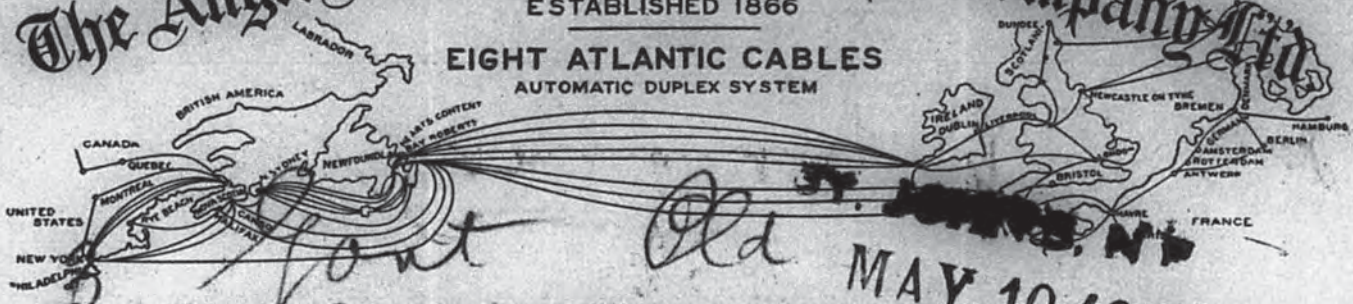
