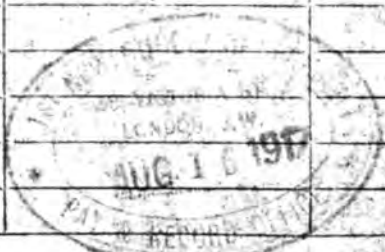

Dear Madam,

In connection with your desire to take passage on a transport to cross the Atlantic, I have to say that there will be no such opportunity to a Canadian port for an indefinite period. We are advised that a steamer will sail to an American port from a certain port here within the next few days, and women and children accepted by this Department can travel on that steamer, provided they have a passport or emergency certificate issued by the British Government and such passport or emergency certificate has been vised by the American Consul-General, 18, Cavendish Square, London, W., or by the American Consul nearest to where you live.

Herewith labels for your baggage. Put the number label next the initial label on each piece of your baggage. In addition to these, every piece of your baggage ought to bear a label having thereon your name and full address of your destination in Canada, so that if by any chance a piece of your baggage was temporarily missing, it could be sent on by the Railway Company from the port of landing.

The Canadian Government or this Department is not responsible for any loss or damage occasioned by the diversion of this steamer from one intended port to another port in Canada or elsewhere, or for loss from any other cause.

The Cabin ocean fare will be £13 per adult; half-fare for children between 1 and 12 years of age; infants 30/-. Third-class ocean fare £7.10.0; half-fare for children between 1 and 12 years of age; infants 10/-. The fares on the railway from the port of landing in the United States to your inland destination in Canada will be considerably higher than they would have been from a Canadian port and you must be prepared to meet this additional expense.

**EVERY PERSON BEFORE EMBARKING MUST HAVE A PASSPORT OR EMERGENCY CERTIFICATE, AS ABOVE MENTIONED, AND THIS MUST BE VISED BY THE AMERICAN CONSUL GENERAL IN LONDON OR THE AMERICAN CONSUL NEAREST TO WHERE YOU LIVE, WHETHER YOU ARE GOING NOW TO RESIDE IN THE UNITED STATES OR IN CANADA. UNLESS YOU HAVE SUCH PASSPORT VISED BY THE AMERICAN CONSUL WE CANNOT SELL YOU A TICKET NOR WILL YOU BE PERMITTED TO EMBARK.**

Immediately you have your passport vised by the American Consul, you should telegraph giving your Christian name and surname, whether you wish accommodation reserved for you or why you cannot go, and unless this telegram is received at this office before 8p.m., on Wednesday, July 24th, your passage on this steamer will be cancelled.
