2. Letter No. 248783-G.2.a. from M.I.5, War Office to P & R.O., 11/1/18.

"I forward you herewith in original a letter which has been intercepted by the censor.

This letter is written by the above-named soldier to his sister in Newfoundland.

The following passage is an extract from the letter:-

"I have a wonderful surprise for you and one which you must not tell to any living creature except Geo.... Fred is not killed and not likely to be. For goodness sake don't let anyone know. . . if you love me don't mention it as it will mean destruction to him and all of us too. Pray don't say so for my sake."

This suggests that the man "Fred" has been posted as a casualty, but in fact a deserter, and that the writer is in touch with him.

This is sent you for your information and any action that you may consider necessary.

Kindly return the original letter when you have finished with it.

2. Reply to above No. 572/7/C, 12/1/18.

With reference to your letter 248783 M.I.5 G.2.a., 11/1/18: I have the honour to state that so far nothing in connection with the matter can be traced in this Office, but further enquiries are being made.

Sgt. Gover's letter is returned as requested with thanks.

3. P & R.O. Memo. No. 571/47/C, 12/1/18 to O.C. 2nd Bn. R. Nfld Regt.

Copy of War Office letter No. 248783 M.I.5.G.2.a., 11/1/18 is enclosed for any enquiries you may think it advisable to make, please.

If the reference applies to Fred Gover, there is no such soldier in the Regiment, but a Trinity man thinks there is a brother of that name serving with the Canadians.

4. Reply thereto 4/2/18 (2220).

Similar correspondence relating ~~xxxxxx~~ to this has been sent direct to the War Office.

5. P & R.O. Letter No. 4356/105/C, 18/3/18 to War Office.

With reference to your Memo 248783, M.I.5.G.2.a., 11/1/18, and this office No. 572/7/C, 12/1/18: I enclose copy of this office No. 571/47/C, 12/1/ & 4/2/18 exchanged with the O.C. 2nd Bn. Newfoundland Regt., Winchester.

As far as I am aware nothing further having transpired, I have the honour to ask if any further action should be taken, and if any purpose would be served by referring the matter to the Minister of Militia, Newfoundland.

6. Letter 268920 M.I.5.G.2.a., 22/3/18 from W.O. to P & R.O. (2738)

I am in receipt of your 4356/105/C of the 18th March, re the above-named, for which many thanks.

This soldier was interviewed by the Commanding Officer of the 2nd Battalion, Royal Newfoundland Regt., on the 24th January last.

His explanation of the intercepted letter was considered unsatisfactory, and a further report was asked for. In the meantime, however, Sergt. GLOVER was transferred to France.

G.H.Q. in France have been asked to interview him again.

7. Letter 269342M.I.5.G.2.a., 27/3/18 from W.O. to P & R.O. (2873)

Please refer to my minute No. 268920 of the 22nd inst re the above named.

I forward you herewith an extract form a report that has been received from G.H.Q., I. (b), France, re Sgt. Gover.

From this report it appears that there is no definite reason to think that Fred Gover is a deserter.

This is sent you in case you care to have any enquiries made in Newfoundland as to the unit in the Canadian Army in which Fred Gover served.

8. Extract from File forwarded by G.H.Q. 1, (b).

re Sgt. H.O.J. Gover.

The above-named was interviewed by G.H.Q., I. (b).

He stated that his brother Fred Gover was a settler in British Columbia, and has not been seen by him for more than four years. He admitted that his brother had visited Newfoundland in the summer of 1914, but he stated that he was away himself, and did not meet him. His brother went from Newfoundland to Montreal where he supposes that he must have enlisted in the Canadian Forces. He has never written to him, and does not know what battalion he was serving, or anything further about him.

His sister, Mrs. King, of Trinity Bay, Newfoundland, has heard from him once, and will, therefore, no doubt, know his unit and regimental number.

Sgt. Gover states that he was informed by his brother, Samuel Gover, whose address is c/o F. Smallwood & Co., St. John's, Newfoundland, in April, 1917, that he had been informed that their brother Fred was a deserter. Questioned as to how his brother Samuel obtained the information, he stated that Samuel was informed by a Major McCarthy (?), of whom he could give no particulars at all.

The only information Sgt. Gover can give with regard to the incident of 18/11/16 is that a friend of his saw a man passing on a bicycle whom he recognised as Frederick Gover. They did not however have dinner together, as stated. Sgt. Gover appeared to feel very strongly his brother's disgrace, and seemed very straightforward in his answers.

The day before Sgt. Gover left Newfoundland, he saw his brother Samuel and pressed him for information concerning Fred. Samuel then said "He is a deserter." He asked him how he knew, and Samuel told him that the news had come from a Major. Sgt. Gover thinks it was a Major McCarthy of the Newfoundland Regt., but it might have been another name such as Carter. Sgt. Gover was so taken aback that he went out without asking any more questions. He has since had correspondence with Samuel, but the question has never been mentioned between them.

Sgt. Gover left Newfoundland in May, 1917. In December 1917 he wrote to his sister saying that Fred was not dead. He did not do so before because he did not wish his sister to know that Fred was a deserter. He eventually told his sister because she had repeatedly asked him if he had heard any more of Fred.

It appears that while Sgt. Gover was in Newfoundland, and before Samuel's statement to him, he heard rumours that Fred was not killed, but that he was a deserter. Beyond this rumour there is nothing definite to show that Fred was a deserter, and that he was not killed as reported by the Newfoundland Authorities.

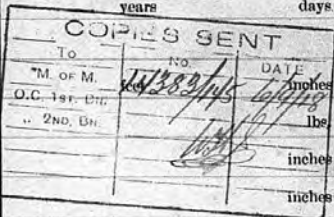
