I wish to draw your attention to my
Son. Pte. George Greeley #1573, of the Royal N. F. L. D.
Regt. who have been overseas since Oct. 1915. And
have been twice wounded. He is medically unfit
for ~~any more~~ ^{further} active service & I feel sure it would
be a justice to his mother & myself as well as
himself personally if you would arrange to have
him returned home & honorably discharged from
the service, when I give my statement for
asking you this. I am sure that the grounds will
be sufficient for you to do so. My Eldest Son
Jacob Greeley have been on Active Service with
the Navy since the outbreak of war as to
was a Naval Reservist of the Newfoundland ^{Royal} Naval
Reservist previously to the war. We have not
heard from him for over two & a half years.
& we wrote you sometime recently to arrange
& send us his Back Pay. My Third Son Pte.
Walter Greeley ^{#280612} was serving at the front with
The "Canadians" & we have just recently received
the sad news that he was killed —

in Action Somewhere in France on Sept 2nd
His mother who is Past the Three Score Year &
ten mark. have been ill since the ~~we~~ sad
News came. as it was unexpected & we didnt
know. He was in the Trenches on account of
only crossing over from England quiet recently.
You will find the official Casualty list herewith
Attached. to Prove my Statement.

If you will investigate this matter. You
will find their record as I have stated. as I
have showed their Regimental Numbers.

I am sure you will agree with me. that
as we are left practically alone. it would be
quite right. that my son George. would be
discharged seeing that. he cannot do any further
service. If he could I would. Not be asking
you this as it wouldnt be my duty to do so.

But I am sure you will agree with me
that it would be Unfair to keep him on. as the
matter stands & we have had Three in the Service
and I think it a good share. towards the Empire

I trust however. that you will find this
a deserving case & arrange. to have him & his
-wife & Child- who. is in Scotland. returned to us
once. again. We came to Canada from Portugal. Cove
Newfoundland in the Spring of 1917 and. I am arranging
to go back this coming Spring. as I am getting too
old for work in this City. trusting to hear from you in
the near future. I am yours truly - Thos. Greely

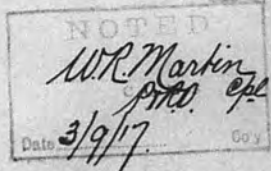

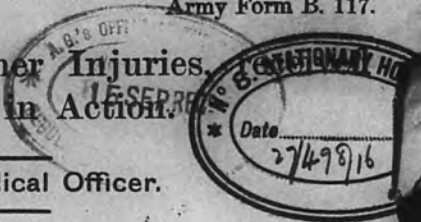


