Dear Madam,

It was with the deepest regret that the Government received a cable from the Record Office, London, intimating that your dear Son, Private Matthew Greeley, had been Killed in Action and buried on the 1st July.

On behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, I desire to express to you the sincerest sympathy in your time of sorrow. But though we feel the parting and though the heart is heavy with its loss, yet is is a glorious thing to think that your gallant boy early responded to the call of duty and made his stand for the establishment of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty upon the earth. We are all proud of our brave and noble boys but no less do we esteem the unselfish fathers and mothers who so willingly gave their boys when the call of duty came. Though your boy has laid down his earthly weapons he wears the soldier's Crown of Victory and his name is inscribed upon the glorious Roll of Honour and will be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow countrymen. When the end of this war comes and an honourable and abiding Peace will have been established, it will be your proud thought that your dear boy did to the utmost of his ability to bring about such result. I trust that the Great Father may give you of his love and comfort at this time.

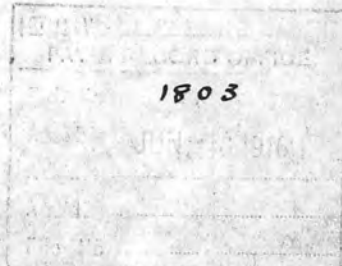

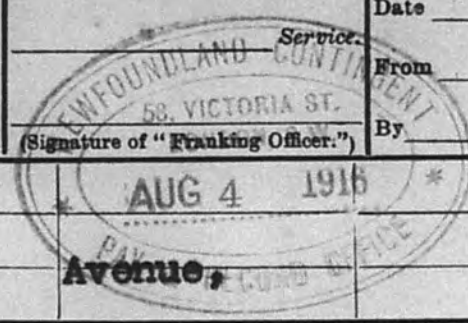

It is my painful duty to inform you that a report has been received from General Headquarters, British Expeditionary Force, notifying the fatality which has overtaken No.1574 Lance Corporal Matthew Greeley, which has been conveyed to you by telegram in accordance with custom; and I am to express the deep sympathy and regret of the Newfoundland Government at your irreparable loss.

The late Soldier was buried on July 1st. at Grave No.7, Knightsbridge, 1 mile West North West of Hamel, $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles North of Albert, by the Rev. H.S. Reid.

If articles or personal property of the late Lance Corporal Greeley are found they will be forwarded to this Office, but some little time will probably elapse before their receipt, and will naturally be subject to customary formalities concerning effects.

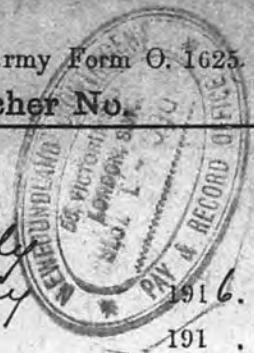
