Re.the Militia Dept.having nothing but my word etc. For any sake do they - I know you don't think I was in the dog gone Hospital as a Boarder, or do they think I'm bluffing. All the information I can give is contained in my complaint to you. I could give more details, but no more names.

As to my Medical Board, I was examined on Feb.24/20 by three Majors of R.A.M.C,how in help am to "ken" their names. If I were a member of the Great Militia Staff", I would tell you how to find partic's, as I am I respectfully suggest that you communicate with Lady Catherine Scott, Town Hall, Hawick (ye ken where auld Hawick is), who will give you at least a copy of my sheets. I have no doubt if high Com's Office inquired they could get the original, at least she told me she had received them from the Hospital. As to where I was boarded. No.15 Atholl Crescent, Edinburgh on Saturday Feb 24/20, as I said before I don't know the Doctors names, I only know that after an hour and a half they told me more than our Local so called Doctors have told me in three years.

No doubt it will take a few months to clear up my case, in meantime I am getting fifteen Bucks per month pension, can nothing be done to give me a chance to live.



With reference to your enquiry at this office two or three days ago and with further reference to your letter of the 12th April applying for an advance of your military allowances, I am directed by the High Commissioner now to state that inasmuch as your disability allowance is payable in advance, it is impossible to let you have more than £10 (ten pounds) from this office, cheque for which amount is enclosed.

With reference to your request to go to Newfoundland, I am to state that a cable message has been received from the Department of Militia in St. John's to the effect that your repatriation to Newfoundland at the expense of the Government cannot be authorised. From this you will see that it is impossible to provide free passages for yourself and your wife to Newfoundland.

If you are still intending to go home and have your operation performed in St. John's rather than in Edinburgh, there is a steamer sailing from Liverpool on the 28th of this month and application for passage should be made personally by you to Messrs. Furness, Withy & Co., Ltd., Royal Liver Buildings, Liverpool.

I am to point out that there are probably greater facilities in Edinburgh for the surgical treatment you require than in St. John's at the present time, and you should take this matter into consideration before definitely applying for passages to return home.





The subject in question being my sons discharge
from the Army. I would not make this request
were it unnecessary, but after perusing what's written
below, I hope you will see the absolute necessity of
my sons discharge. I ask the above favour on the
following grounds.

I will begin by telling you, I am the mother of three
sons, all of whom are serving in His Majesty's Forces.
When my health was unimpaired, and my only
draughter able to assist me in my daily routine, I
most gladly gave my free consent, to the wishes
of my sons, desirous of serving The King.
Now however the case is altered, during
the past months, my health has grad-
ually failed me,

and I am now under continuous treatment from the local Medical Practitioner (Dr Barnochan). My daughter of whom I spoke above, is now in hospital, suffering from a disease, which will incapacitate her from ever doing any work of an arduous nature in future.

The son for whose discharge, I am applying enlisted with the original five hundred (Pte A P. Greens. No 2 01), and saw Active Service, both in Gallipoli and France.

Prior to his leaving for Active Service he contracted Rheumatism at Salisbury Plains, which troubled him exceedingly all through the Campaign.

At Gallipoli he was stricken down, with Dysentery and Malaria, and spent four months in hospital in Egypt. He was however able to rejoin his Regiment, before leaving Egypt, and later proceeded with them to France. He served with them there up to July first, when in that battle he was wounded.

One of the wounds received rendered it necessary, for him to have an operation performed, some three months, after his arrival home.

The Operation in itself was successful, but owing to the Rheumatism contracted, as stated above 'The wound is still irritable and painful', and according to Mr Peggan, who operated on him, it is doubtful if he can do more than light duty for a long time to come.

By his last Medical Board, he was granted two months furlough, which terminates on March 4th/7.. Knowing this I find it necessary, to write Your Excellency, before the termination of his furlough, and ask 'that he be discharged'.

When you consider that all my sons, are at present in the Service, that my Daughter is an invalid, and I myself have been for some years past a widow, then I feel sure Sir You will see fit to grant my request.

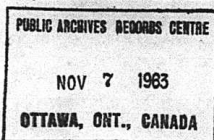
