

## Opinion of the Medical Board.

**Notes.**—(i.) Clear and decisive answers to the following questions are to be carefully filled in by the Board, as in the event of the man being invalided, it is essential that the Commissioners of Chelsea Hospital should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable them to decide upon the man's claim to pension.

- (ii.) Expressions such as "may," "might," "probably," &c., should be avoided.
- (iii.) The rates of pension vary directly according to whether the disability is attributed to (a) active service, (b) climate, or (c) ordinary military service. Dear Mr. Squires:-

I am in receipt of your letter of Feb. 4th referring to the case of Herbert Gulliver.

This man enrolled for war service in the Royal Naval Reserve on 29th Oct., 1914 as No. 1274X, and was discharged (time expired) after having been overseas on service on 17th of April, 1916.

He enlisted in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment on 27th April, 1916, regimental number 2620, and was discharged on the 11th July, 1917, no longer fit for war service on account of wounds received in action. His total war service was two years, two hundred and forty eight days, which entitled him to five payments of \$70.00 each, or \$350.00, which sum he has received.

Claim for Separation Allowance on account of this man has been made by Mrs. Diana Roseworthy of Tessier Place (his mother). This claim was considered on Jan. 3rd, 1920 and decision deferred receipt of affidavit re separation from husband. This affidavit was subsequently received and showed that about four years ago separation of Mr. Levi and Mrs. Diana Roseworthy was ordered by the Court without obligation on his part to support. The claim for Separation Allowance was reconsidered on January 17th and was refused because a third son of military age and unmarried had not enlisted, and the regulations were not complied with.
