I have the honour to inform you that I have relinquished the command of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment on transfer to the Home establishment - the reason being that the Divisional Commander considered, and I agreed with him, that I needed a rest after the strenuous times which we had been through -

I may remind you that I have held the command of the Regt. for over two years, having assumed command in Gallipoli - During that period we went through the evacuation of Suvla, followed by that of Helles - then a very strenuous 2½ months training at Suez, which was put to the test on the memorable



July 1<sup>st</sup> Then on Oct. 12<sup>th</sup> at Guedecourt we had  
our first success - & then lost gear on Aug: 16<sup>th</sup>  
& Oct. 9<sup>th</sup> we took part in two more successful  
battles, followed by 14 strenuous days at  
Cambrai in which the Regiment did magnificently.

It is with the deepest regret that I handed over  
the command, but I know that it was for  
the best, as after such a strenuous time I  
felt that I badly needed a rest -

I can only say that I shall always look upon  
it as the greatest honour I have commanded the  
Regiment during this period in which we  
have done so much, and I could not wish  
for better officers or men -

Although I am not a Newfoundland soldier I have  
always tried to identify myself with your interests  
& throughout I have always been actuated solely  
by the question of efficiency & the honour of the



Regiment.

To what extent I may have succeeded or failed it is perhaps too early to judge, but the record of the Regiment speaks for itself.

I have only one regret, and that will always be with me, namely the loss of so many officers & men who have died while under my command, many of whom were my personal friends, and whose loss I feel deeply.

Should I be spared & survive this war I shall look forward to the day when I am able to visit Newfoundland & renew the many friendships which I have made, & see the country about which I have heard so much.





Dear Timewell -

Each Division holding the front trenches provided its own rear guard - and of course there were several Divisions doing this.

As regards the 29<sup>th</sup> Division, the 88<sup>th</sup> Bde (of which we are one of the 4 Regts) was holding the front line. Three out of the 4 Regts, including ourselves were holding the front line trenches, so we were part of the rear guard. Each Regt gradually withdrew simultaneously at fixed hours, so at the very last there was a small party of each Regt as the final rear party.

It was a wonderful operation, and the conduct of our men left nothing to be desired. It was an extremely anxious time, and instead of being a most brilliant success might easily have been a great disaster. I checked Lieut H. Rendell & 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieut Clift (Bombing Officer) to be in charge of the last party to leave our trenches. The work of the Regt at the evacuation of Heller was equally good as I have already informed the Governor. Although not actually finding the rear guard, our duty was equally important and quite as trying.
