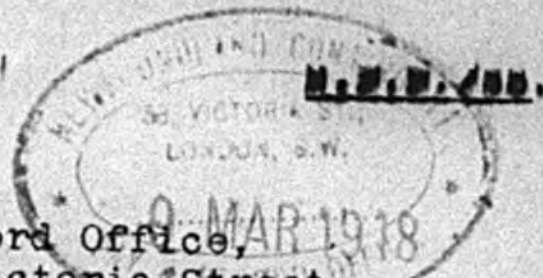



If I do not receive an answer to this letter within a reasonable time. My next one will be to the press, so that someone will see what a grateful country is doing for her disabled soldiers

I think its perfectly scandalous to be treated in such a way.

I have been discharged from hospital since "July 12. 1919" and never a cent of my Gratitude got. And I am pretty badly in need of it too.
