The above-named ex-soldier served in the Regiment named during the war of 1914-18. He has since been and still is drawing a pension. At the time of his discharge he apparently did not receive any bonus or gratuity which he now learns other members of the Regiment, who served under similar conditions, did receive. Recently he learned of one who had received \$60.00 per month for six months after his discharge.

Mr. Haley has asked us to communicate with you and see if perhaps he is not entitled to some amount representing the gratuity he was entitled to after his discharge and which he probably did not receive as he came immediately to Canada and has since lived in this country.

We understand he enlisted in St. Johns, Newfoundland, on February 2nd, 1915, and was discharged there on February 8th, 1917. He is at present living with his family at 355 Wilson Street, in this City.

NOTES.—(i.) Clear and decisive answers to the following questions are to be carefully filled in by the Board, as in the event of the man being invalided, it is essential that the Commissioners of Chelsea Hospital should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable them to decide upon the man's claim to pension.

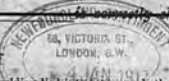




